JUNE 21: ST. ALOYSIUS GONZAGA



Aloysius' father planned on making him a soldier from the time that Aloysius was very little. His father sent him to train with the soldiers while he also studied. Even though Aloysius knew his dad wanted him to be a soldier, Aloysius planned on living his life for God from the time that he was 9 years old. When he was young, he got sick with a kidney disease. While he was getting better, Aloysius had lots of time to read about Jesus and the lives of the Saints and this helped him love God even more. Aloysius' dad would not let him become a priest for a long time, so instead he taught the poor about Jesus. Finally, when Aloysius was 18 years old his father let him join the Jesuit order. He gave up all of his riches to his brother and took a vow of poverty (to live like the poor) and did whatever the order asked him to do. When the plague (a really bad disease) spread all over Rome, Aloysius volunteered to help with the sick and the dying. He soon became sick as well and although he got better he was always very weak. He died when he was only 23 years old, and so he became an example for youth all over the world of how to live life for Jesus.

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL FROM MATTHEW...

DEAR CLONMELIANS,

It's harvest time! In my priesthood, I've been assigned to two parishes that make one especially aware of when the annual harvest of wheat is being cut. As I go out in the evenings to walk Klex I have been greeted by an endless parade of semi-trailers hauling wheat to the elevators. It's helped the cycle of the year feel a bit more normal and for that I am grateful.

While there are signs of returning to normal, there are also reminders that things are not completely without risk in our community. It is note-worthy that the numbers of COVID-19 cases continue at a steady rate in our area. Thankfully, our hospitals are not being overwhelmed. If you are at an elevated risk due to age or health concerns, I encourage you to continue taking measures to assure your safety by exercising social distancing, sanitation practices, and wearing a mask while in public.

At this time the bishop's dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass is continued (meaning you do not have to attend Mass). While we are allowed to have gatherings (such as our women's Lectio Divina group on Monday evenings) we are asking that parishioners practice social distancing while meeting. If you are not able to remain 6 feet apart you are encouraged to consider wearing a mask for your safety and the safety of others.
