JUNE 28: ST. IRENAEUS



Irenaeus' parents were faithful Catholics and while Irenaeus was still young he was sent to study under the Bishop of Smyrna, the great Saint Polycarp who had been a disciple of St. John. Irenaeus knew that Bishop Polycarp was an amazing man and he carefully watched and listened to everything the bishop said, so that he could become holy like his teacher. After studying many years with Bishop Polycarp he was sent to Lyons, France to help Bishop Pothinus (who later became a saint as well). Many of the people in France were turning their hearts away from God and leaving the Church. Irenaeus helped Bishop Pothinus teach them the Truth so that they would believe in Jesus again. Bishop Pothinus made Irenaeus a priest. As a priest he spent lots of time teaching people about the faith and showing people that they were wrong to turn away from Jesus. These teachings and the books that he wrote about the Catholic faith made him a Doctor of the Church. He was killed because of his faith in God and became a martyr in Lyons, France.

DEAR CLONMELIANS,

Greetings to you as we officially begin summer. The weeks and months pass very quickly, but this year the virus has made things go by even more quickly for me. Please remember to pray for members of our community who are affected by this pandemic. Also pray for our older parishioners as well as those with compromised health concerns. I am aware that many continue to have serious concerns about the virus and how we are responding to assure people are safe.

Communication from the Bishop this week has extended our guidelines into and through the month of July. The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass will remain in effect for everyone and events at the parish must continue to adhere to the 33% capacity with social distancing in place. Masks are still not required, but you are encouraged to wear them.

Concerns about attending Sunday Mass

Two options for those who have serious concerns about returning to public Mass.

-First, consider attending a daily Mass. There are fewer people present and you can easily socially distance yourself. The amount of time in the church is about half of a Sunday liturgy, reducing your exposure time. Daily Masses are at 8:00 AM on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday. The Wednesday Mass is at 6:30 PM (and few people attend that evening Mass).

-Second, you may wish to attend the Saturday evening vigil at 5:30 PM. Although the church has not reached capacity during this Mass I keep the overflow open and available. You are welcome to sit in the parish center where we will send a minister over to distribute Communion.

Our summer Patriotic Rosary and Concert by our brass group "Acclaim" will take place this Sunday, June 28th at 6:00 PM on the lawn in front of the rectory.
