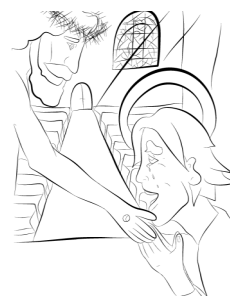

JULY 12: ST. JOHN GAULBERT



St. John was called Giovanni (which is Italian for John) when he was born. His mom and dad did not follow Jesus. His brother was killed by one of Giovanni's friends, and this made him and his dad very mad. Giovanni was so mad that he wanted to kill the man who killed his brother. When he had the chance to kill him, his friend begged Giovanni to forgive him for the love of Jesus, who died for us. Even though it was very hard, Giovanni walked away from him and found a Church. At the Church he knelt in front of the cross and asked Jesus to forgive him for hating the man who killed his brother. The statue of Jesus on the cross, bowed down to him, and said that he was forgiven. From that moment Giovanni believed in God and gave his whole life to Jesus. He joined the Benedictine monks and later started his own community of monks, who spent their time helping the poor.

Dear Clonmelians,

Beginning this weekend (11-12 July, 2020) I strongly encourage you to wear a mask when attending Mass or other activities at St. John, Clonmel as an act of charity toward others who may be more concerned or are facing health conditions that place them at higher risk.

Being grateful! It's easy to overlook gratitude, to become distracted by other things, or to adopt a more negative outlook on life, but being grateful is an effective way to keep our eyes fixed on the Lord. We are called to put our trust in Him during these unusual and uncertain times. It has come to my attention how blessed we are here in the diocese of Wichita. All of our parishes are operational and able to provide the sacraments to those who need or desire them. There are dioceses and/or parishes around our country who continue to experience either partial or total shutdown due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

There are many contributing factors, however I wish to draw your gratefulness to the diocese and our clergy in particular. Bishop Kemme has established guidelines that conform to the health department guidelines. These include social distancing, using hand sanitizer, sanitizing the church after every service, and reducing communally touched surfaces. He has also recently requested that everyone wear a mask over the mouth and nose to reduce exposure via aerosol. While strongly encouraging us to implement these practices, Bishop Kemme has not mandated practices that some may believe infringe on their personal rights. Although the wearing of masks is requested and strongly encouraged, those who choose to not wear a mask will neither be shamed for their decision nor turned away from attending Masses.

The second issue that is cause for gratitude is the youth of our presbyterate (the priests). We have a young clergy who are able and willing to step forward in serving our diocese. I have recently heard that some dioceses have some parishes open and others that remain closed because of the large number of elderly priests serving in those parishes. Priests in their advanced years are obviously at much higher risk if exposed to the COVID-19 virus. If we had elderly priests actively serving full-time in our parishes it would be appropriate to allow them to decide if they felt comfortable serving public Masses at this time.

I propose that we renew of gratitude by reflecting on how blessed we are in the diocese of Wichita. Rather than deteriorating into arguments of what's right or wrong, about personal vs. communal rights and responsibilities, or about making the arguments political in nature, I encourage you to see the directives and the strong recommendations of our bishop as an act of charity to others who may be more concerned or at greater risk than yourself. I request that all attending Mass at St. John's, Clonmel wear a mask as an act of charity for others.
