AUGUST 23: ST. JEAN JUGAN



Jean was born into a poor family who had 8 children. Her father died when Jean was only 3 years old and her mother had to work very hard to keep her family fed and clothed. The children had to start working when they were very young too in order to help their mother. When Jean was 16 years old she began to work for a kind, Christian woman as her kitchen maid. This kind woman prayed with Jean and they would visit the sick and poor that lived close by. This made Jean want to work at the hospital caring for the sick and so she did for 6 years, until she was too tired to continue that type of work. She then went to work for another kind and holy woman, Mlle. Lecoq. Together they would pray for hours a day and they would go to Mass and help the priest there. They taught catechism to the children in town and cared for the poor around them. After Mlle. Lecoq died, Jean moved in with another older lady and an orphan girl and together these 3 women started a community of prayer and service to the poor. They also started to open up their home to the poor, abandoned women of the town. This community of women gave everything they had to help the poor and as more women joined them, they had to go out asked for food and clothing. Before Jean died her community of 3 women has spread through Europe and even in other countries, with 2,400 women. This community became known as "The Little Sisters of the Poor".

HOLY FATHER'S AUGUST PRAYER INTENTION

We pray for all those who work and live from the sea, among them sailors, fishermen and their families.

WHO JESUS IS TO US

Let us reflect for a moment on Peter's discipleship. He willing drops his fishing nets to follow Jesus, but expresses fear and doubt when he sees Jesus walking on the water. Peter proclaims great faith in Jesus before large crowds, but when put to the test, denies Him three times. In moments of great intensity, such as the Transfiguration, Peter fumbles his words and can't quite grasp the immensity of the man before him. Basically, Peter is human, just like us. He is guilty of thinking "not as God does, but as human beings do" (Mt 16:23). Isn't it reassuring that, like Peter, we have been invited into discipleship in spite of all our human limitations? Jesus seeks relationship with US! When Jesus asks Peter, "But who do you say that I am?", He is genuinely interested in how His dear friend will respond. The same is true of you and I! Jesus asks us this same question! We are reminded that our discipleship is so much more than what we know and what we do; it must start with a very personal relationship with Jesus Christ. We must be able to explain who Jesus is to us, and to do so, we must understand Him in a very intimate way. Seek Him out in Adoration and prayer. Set aside time to converse with Him. Invite Him into your day!

PRAYER OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.
