SEPTEMBER 6: BLESSED BERTRAND



Bertrand was born in Nimes, France. During this time, there were many religious wars being fought in the country and there was much confusion about the Church's teachings. Despite of all this, Bertrand's parents were very faithful followers of Jesus and taught Bertrand the true faith. Bertrand was very holy and prayerful as a young man and decided to become a priest. As a priest, he felt called to missionary work which is where he met his friend Dominic. Together the two formed a new religious order called the Order of Preachers or the "Dominicans" as they were often called. Bertrand started the order in the cities of Paris and Bologna. He spent his days preaching the Good News of the Gospel and drawing many people to Jesus. He died while he was preaching a sermon in 1230 AD. He was only 35 years old.

DISCIPLESHIP IS NOT AN EASY PATH

As you know, discipleship is not an easy path. Sometimes we are called to have difficult conversations with one another. In the passage from Ezekiel, we find God instructing the prophet to speak out against his brother's wicked behavior. We see a similar message in today's reading from Matthew. We are to settle disputes and help usher the Kingdom into our world, yet our culture tells us to mind our own business...to focus on the plank in our own eye. What are we to do?? Paul points us in the right direction when he says, "Love does no evil...love is the fulfillment of the law." We are to admonish one another in love, AND we are to receive one another in love. Indifference is not loving. Condemnation is not loving. Defensiveness is not loving. If we truly love our neighbor as we love ourselves, we will make sacrifices to save them from death, and we would want them to do the same in return. Pray for courage, grace, and humility, lest your hearts become hardened!

As the building committee continues its work on the schematic design of the new church I wanted to present to you the process of how we chose an architectural style for the building. There is no prevailing architectural style here in Clonmel, KS (even the elevators have significantly changed styles over the years). Our buildings have differing styles as well.

The building committee looked at these issues and decided that we could look farther back into our heritage. We began looking at the church in Clonmel, Ireland. Their church had an architectural style the committee felt could be incorporated into our building. I present here an image of the church in Clonmel, Ireland. As the design phase progresses, we will present drawings to the parish of the proposed new church building, where we hope you will notice some similarity to the architectural style of the Clonmel church in Ireland.



The line in red shows an architectural feature you will find in the drawings of our new church. The materials will be different and the church will look quite different, however these modified gothic arches are being incorporated into our new building. The committee is pleased to be able to include elements from our heritage in Ireland.
