SEPTEMBER 27: ST. VINCENT DE PAUL



Vincent de Paul was born on a farm near the small town of Gascony in Southern France. His parents were poor but were able to send him to school where he was taught by Franciscan priests. He went to university in Toulouse, France to study about God. When he was finished, he was ordained a priest. One day, he was hearing the confession of a poor man who was dying. God used that experience to open Vincent's eyes to the needs of the poor. From that time on, he devoted his life to caring for poor people. He started many charities to help poor people. Some included taking care of criminals, opening hospitals for children who did not have parents and for old people, and sending missionaries to many different countries. He also started the Congregation of the Sisters of Charity (Blessed Mother Theresa's religious order). Vincent de Paul never took any praise for helping the poor. He always knew it was God who worked through him to make these good things happen. He died in Paris on September 27, 1660.

Our Annual Report gives an overview of the state of our parish including demographic, stewardship, prayer and sacramental, educational, and financial data. We are excited to be able to bring you this information in a way that brings the life of our parish into a comprehensive focus. This report follows the launching of our new parish website earlier this year. Both of these projects took significant time and effort on the part of our parish staff. I am especially grateful for the leadership that Cassi FitzGerald (our Parish Life Coordinator) took in managing both of those projects to completion. They are tremendously helpful in communicating with parishioners.

Master Plan presented to the Diocesan Building Committee

Five members of our Building Committee, along with our architect, presented our Master Plan and developing schematic design for a new church to the Diocesan Building Committee. The Diocesan Building Committee is comprised of building and architecture professionals, priests of the diocese, and several members of parishes from around the diocese with various skills.

The Diocesan Building Committee expressed support of the project, noting that the master plan would glorify God beautifully along K-42. Their feedback was thought-provoking and will be further considered by our building committee.

We have scheduled three town hall meetings where a review of progress will be presented and you will have an opportunity to ask questions or provide feedback about the building project. Our Mass attendance has been increasing and to date there have been no reports of members contracting COVID-19 through contact at Mass or at events in our parish center.

I am uncertain if Bishop plans to extend his dispensation from attending Sunday Mass. I would encourage families to develop their own plan for when that option is no longer available. You may not need it prior to a vaccination, but that is not guaranteed. Those who have underlying medical conditions or have at-risk family living with them would continue to be exempt from the obligation if Bishop lifts the dispensation. Your personal health always outweighs the obligation of attending Sunday Mass.

I do encourage those with continuing concerns to consider two options:

1. Attend daily Mass once per week.
2. Consider attending Sunday Mass at the 5:30 PM or 10:30 AM in the parish center.
