OCTOBER 18: ST. LUKE



Luke lived during the time of Jesus. He was born in Greece, a gentile, not Jewish, and a doctor. Because he was a gentile he did not grow up believing in God, but when he heard Paul preaching the Good News about Jesus, Luke believed what Paul said and gave his life to Jesus. He left Greece and followed Paul wherever he went, preaching the Good News with Paul, and helping many people come to know Jesus. He spent time with Mary, Jesus' Mother, so that he could learn all about Jesus. He wrote two books in the Bible: the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles. Since he had spent time with Mary listening to her, the Gospel of Luke tells us the most about the Annunciation, the birth of Jesus, and the first years of the Holy Family. The Acts of the Apostles tells us about the first few years after Jesus' death and resurrection and how the Apostles spread the Gospel. St. Luke's yes to Jesus meant that people all over the world could read the Good News about Jesus and say yes to Jesus.

DEAR CLONMELIANS,

This weekend the diocese is introducing its theme for our 2020 Stewardship renewal: FIAT.

There is a beautifully painted image of the Blessed Virgin Mary that is our stewardship focus for this year that will hanging in the gathering space of our church, in all of our parish center classrooms, and on all of our stewardship renewal materials this year. This image of Mary is meant to depict her at the moment of the annunciation, where Mary gave her "fiat" her "yes" to becoming the mother of God. Pope St. John Paul II said "Mary as Mother became the first 'disciple' of her Son, the first to whom he seemed to say: 'Follow me'..."



Mary's discipleship is not just about following Jesus in the easy moments, the good moments, but Mary's discipleship follows Jesus all the way to Calvary. She is living her life as a grateful response, recognizing and receiving what God has given her, and sharing those gifts with others.

You and I are called to respond as disciples the same way that Mary did, with a great "fiat" or "yes" to following Jesus, in the best of times and the worst of times. No doubt that we are all experiencing our own shares of hardships, difficulties, and sorrows as we finish out 2020, but as disciples of Jesus, we have much to say "yes" to, we have a grateful response to give to God as we recognize and receive what He has given us, and we seek to share what he has given us with others.

That is what the Stewardship Way of Life is all about.

Over the next month we will be gearing up for our annual stewardship renewal. Our Stewardship Council members have been hard at work preparing materials and planning for the renewal of the Stewardship Way of Life in our parish. But Stewardship relies on the active participation of all of our parishioners, a personal renewal of each of us to say "fiat", "yes", to following Jesus as his disciple and committing to making our parish one that is welcoming, prayerful, formative, and of service to others. I invite you to start thinking now about all that you have been given by God, all that you have to be grateful for, recognize those gifts, and begin to see where you might be able to share those gifts with others. Consider which ministry in the parish could benefit from your God given gifts, from your time and your prayer, and bring that to the Lord, asking Him where you might be able to serve Him well.

Turn to Mary our Mother as an example of Stewardship and ask for her assistance to follow her Son as His disciple at all times of your life. With Mary's guidance, may we always give the grateful response of our own "fiat", our own "yes" to Jesus.
