JANUARY 17: ST. ANTHONY OF EGYPT



When Anthony was 20 years old, his parents died and Anthony was left with all their money and the responsibility of taking care of his sister. God. Even though he wanted to be alone, lots of people came to him for prayer and advice, because Anthony was so close to God. He told everyone to always pray, be humble and good. Anthony lived to be 105 years old.

COMING AND SEE

"He said to them, 'Come, and you will see.'" In today's gospel, Jesus invites us into His space. Discipleship does not happen from afar. Relationship with Jesus, as with others, often begins from afar, but Jesus acknowledges—even anticipates—our curiosity and draws us in. In today's first reading, Samuel, who is unfamiliar with the LORD, hears a voice calling to him in his sleep. Perhaps this is how Jesus reaches out to you — with quiet and persistent subtlety. In the gospel, Jesus looks directly at the disciples and invites them to follow Him. Maybe Jesus has been this blatant in His call to you. Regardless of how He reaches out to you, your FIAT begins when you respond to Jesus' invitation to come and see.

DEAR CLONMELIANS,

I greet you from an undisclosed place of quarantine and prayer. I am with Fr. Nic Jurgensmeyer at his family's cabin, where he has been teaching me some skills of cooking (that will take more than a 10-day quarantine). We both tested positive for COVID-19 last weekend, leaving us with an opportunity to quarantine in community and for our dogs to have a companion (Fr. Nic has a black lab). To quarantine by yourself adds an additional challenge for many people. If you are aware of someone quarantining alone, I would encourage you to reach out to them by phone, text, or email.

My symptoms have been minor and have included chills and a low-grade fever, headache, running nose, body aches, and a very persistent and obnoxious back pain between my shoulder blades. Back pain can be a symptom of COVID in some people. I've been able to manage my symptoms with over-the-counter medications and have not needed any further medical attention. I also watch my O2 saturation levels, which have remained very good.

As the virus continues to make its way through our community I pray that its effects will be minor and that those most vulnerable due to comorbid medical issues will be spared contracting the virus. I also pray that the vaccinations will be readily available to those who need or desire to take it very soon. Finally, I pray that our community and our world will soon be able to move beyond this pandemic, grateful for the lessons that accompanied this time of the virus.

Thank you for all of your prayers during my recovery. Hopefully my symptoms will subside soon and I will be able to return to work at the end of my 10-day quarantine.
