**DEAR CLONMELIANS**

This week I've been thinking back to where we were a year ago. We were at home. All of us. Preparing for a Holy Week unlike any other, a week that stretched us, and awakened in us an intense desire for the Church and to receive the Eucharist, one that had likely been dulling for quite some time.

So now, one year later, I want to take this time to remind you of where we were a year ago, remind you of that fire that ached inside of you to just be in the church for Mass with your parish family. That fire to receive the Eucharist and be so closely united to Jesus that He literally dwells within you.

And with that reminder I want to invite you to enter in to this most sacred and holy week, with everything that you have and everything that you are. St. Thomas Aquinas in his prayer before Mass reminds us of our need:

*Almighty and ever-living God, I approach the sacrament of Your only-begotten Son Our Lord Jesus Christ, I come sick to the doctor of life, unclean to the fountain of mercy, blind to the radiance of eternal light, and poor and needy to the Lord of heaven and earth.*

*Lord, in your great generosity, heal my sickness, wash away my defilement, enlighten my blindness, enrich my poverty, and clothe my nakedness. May I receive the bread of angels, the King of kings and Lord of lords, with humble reverence, with the purity and faith, the repentance and love, and the determined purpose that will help to bring me to salvation. May I receive the sacrament of the Lord's Body and Blood, and it's reality and power.*

*Kind God, may I receive the Body of Your only-begotten Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, born from the womb of the Virgin Mary, and so be received into His mystical body and numbered among His members.*

*Loving Father, as on my earthly pilgrimage I now receive Your beloved Son under the veil of a sacrament, may I one day see him face to face in glory, who lives and reigns with You for ever. Amen.*

There will be many things that try to tear our attention away from our Lord this week, our jobs, the news, television, politics, scandal, anger, fear, family, friends, you name it. Hang on to that memory of last year, of how badly you would have done anything to be in the church during Holy Week to participate in the Mass and receive our Lord in the Eucharist and let that drive you. Let that desire to be united with Jesus drive you to stay by His side this week. Walk through Holy Week with Him, set aside a little extra time each day to pray, to read the scriptures for that day. On Holy Thursday, when the Triduum starts, take full advantage of every opportunity you have to be present in a church and receive our Lord with utmost thanksgiving. We "come sick to the doctor of life, unclean to the fountain of mercy" but there in the midst of Holy Week He will surely meet us.
