APRIL 4 : ST. ISIDORE OF SEVILLE



Isidore was born to a holy and devout family. Two of his brothers and one of his sisters also became saints. Isidore's father died when he was small and his older brother Leander was put in charge of Isidore. Leander became frustrated and angry at Isidore because he felt that Isidore was not trying hard enough at his studies. He was mean to Isidore. Isidore soon realized that if he tried hard enough, he could learn all that his older brother wanted him to. He started taking his school more seriously and is now remembered for being one of the smartest people to have lived during his time. Isidore used his knowledge to start seminaries and Catholic universities in every Diocese in Spain. He also wrote many books; he wrote about the heroes and heroines of the Bible; he wrote a dictionary; an encyclopedia and one book was on the history of the world. Isidore later became a priest and then Bishop of Seville; he served 37 years in that role. The people of Seville loved their Bishop because he showed them Jesus' love. Poor people were always welcomed in his home and in the last year of his life, his house was crowded with the poor, as he served them with Jesus' love until he died. Because of the great teachings he left for the Church, St. Isidore was named a Doctor of the Church.

Happy Easter!

It is a great joy to know that we can be together this Easter. Just one year ago we were all restricted to watching Easter celebrations online due to concerns about spreading the COVID-19 virus. We have much to give thanks for this Easter.

Remember that Easter is not just one day. The celebration of Easter day actually lasts for eight days. This full octave communicates to us the importance the church puts on this special feast. Easter and Christmas are the only two feasts with an octave to celebrate the day. Following Easter day, we are given an entire season to celebrate. The Easter season lasts until Pentecost. From Easter until Pentecost it is appropriate to greet one another with "Happy Easter" or "Christ is Risen." Such practices remind us that Easter is more than a day. Easter is a season. Easter is our life, for everything we do leads us to Easter and flows from Easter.

Feasibility Study

The feasibility study has been completed. Betty Johnson will present those findings to the building committee within a few weeks and then to the parish. Thank you to all who participated in the study. It's important to have your voices heard as we continue our journey.

COVID-19 Restriction Changes

I am hearing that some dioceses across our country are beginning to announce changes to the dispensation from Mass and COVID restrictions. Our diocese had some of the least restrictive policies in the country and Bishop Kemme has further eased some of those restrictions.

Beginning with Easter we will enjoy the return of holy water in the fonts at the entrance of the church and in the large vat in our entry-way. Our hymnals, Bibles, and Missals are now permitted back in the pews. This allows for more congregational singing, reflection on Sacred Scripture, and the ability to follow the readings in the Missal.

I anticipate that Bishop Kemme will lift his dispensation from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass sometime during the Easter season if COVID rates remain low and the percentage of vaccinations continues to increase.
