MAY 16: ST. UBALD



Ubald grew up with his Uncle who was a Bishop. He received a good education and after finishing school became a priest. Many years later he was made a Bishop of the town that he grew up in, Gubbio in Italy. Bishop Ubald was known as a peacemaker. In many ways he helped his people to live in peace with one another and he was not afraid to do what he needed to do to help people live peacefully. He stopped fights in the street, he forgave those who treated him badly, he even stopped an Emperor from attacking his town just by meeting with him and talking to him. As he got old, Bishop Ubald got very sick. Even though he felt a lot of pain, he still did all he could for his people and he never complained. When he died on this day in the year 1160, all the people cried because they loved him so much.

PRAYER LINE REQUESTS

Did you know we have a parish prayer line? Many parishioners have graciously agreed to pray for the needs of your family and friends through the use of the parish prayer line and we'd like to encourage you to make use of it!

How does the parish prayer line work?

Call the parish office or use our online prayer request form on the website to let us know you or someone you know needs prayer and we will send out an automatic call to everyone on the parish prayer line so that they are made aware of the need. The only criteria, due to privacy laws, is that you must have permission from the person named in the prayer request or an immediate family member of theirs in order for us to publicize it. The prayer line is used to request prayers for emergencies, accidents, surgeries, illness, death, loss of jobs or hardships of any kind, and many other reasons not listed!

How do I receive requests from the prayer line?

If you would like to receive the calls from the parish prayer line, contact Madelyn in the parish office to be added to the list!

MEAL TRAIN REQUESTS

Did you know we have a parish Meal Train to provide meals to families in times of need? We'd like to encourage you to use it!

Who could use a Meal Train? How to get meals?

Families who have welcomed a new baby (birth/adoption), are suffering an injury/illness, or are grieving a loss to name a few. If you, or someone you know could use meals, please contact the parish office and we'll get a meal train started for you or get in contact with the family to see if they would like meals.

How do I help with providing meals for a Meal Train?

Many people signed up to help with Meal Trains during our Stewardship Renewal. However if at any time you'd like to be added to the list call the office and you'll get added on!

The Meal Train ministry is in need of a coordinator!

Ideally someone who might know when parishioners could use meals, has a friendly demeanor and great deal of compassion.

This position would involve:

- Reaching out to the families that may want meals
- Gathering info about allergies, days for meals, drop off times
- Using a site like Take Them a Meal to share those details with the Meal Train parish volunteers.

DEAR CLONMELIANS,

I wanted to bring to your attention a very important matter regarding the dignity of life and upcoming legislation particular to the state of Kansas. The August of 2022 voter ballot will contain an amendment to the Kansas Constitution entitled Value Them Both Amendment. This amendment should be fully supported and promoted by Catholics as a means of protecting the unborn, women, and families.

A Kansas Supreme Court ruling from a couple years ago has left no legal protections related to abortion. That ruling also meant that any prior laws are considered unconstitutional if challenged in the courts. Such laws include parental consent, informed consent, and abortion facility safety/cleanliness regulations. If the Value Them Both Amendment is passed by popular vote it will reinstate prior laws that protect unborn children and their mothers. It also paves the way for future protections related to the horror of abortion.

Please pray for the passing of this amendment and help spread the word about its importance. It is over a year away; however, it is anticipated that many anti-life voices will be spreading misinformation about this amendment. We cannot remain silent or assume that the good people of our state will turn out to vote for this amendment. It is our duty to promote this good effort to protect women and children.

I encourage you to follow the Kansas Catholic Conference (KCC) and Kansans for Life (KFL) for additional information and ways of becoming involved in promoting this opportunity to shape our laws in Kansas.
