**JUNE 13: ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA**

Anthony was born in Portugal and was named Fernand when he was born. His family was rich and his parents wanted Fernand to become an important man in their city, but Fernand only wanted to be a priest. After getting a really good education, Fernand joined the Augustinian friars. When he was 25 years old he was inspired to join the Franciscans because 5 Franciscan brothers had been martyred for the faith and Fernand also wanted to give his life for Jesus. When he became a brother he took the name Anthony. He became an amazing teacher of the faith and preached all over Italy and in France too. He was able to explain the faith in very simple words and so honestly that everyone who heard him could understand and came to believe in Jesus. Because of this gift in teaching the faith, the Church made him a Doctor of the Church. He died at a young age near Padua in Italy. Many people asked him to pray for them after he died and many miracles happened because of his intercession to Jesus.

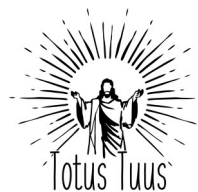

**A TENDER SHOOT**

Today's first reading offers a beautiful image of tearing off "a tender shoot" from a cedar tree and planting it on a high mountain. Most of us are quite familiar with the cedar tree — it's unique aroma and the supple nature of its young branches. Let's apply this image to our own discipleship. A tender shoot, torn off a more mature branch, can be planted straight into the ground. This little shoot—like you and I—may have been comfortable where it was, but it has been called to another task. It is young, but it has a powerful life force within it. This shoot has been carefully selected and planted with great purpose. Like this little branch, you and I are sometimes thrust into positions that we didn't choose; but we always have the ability to choose how we respond. FIAT means recognizing the life force within us and trusting God to use us as He sees fit.

This past week we had over 20 young men participate in our Altar Server Training Camp including 7 young men who had never served before. Over the 3 day training they received talks on discipline, decorum, and piety. They practiced different drills having to do with decorum while serving at the altar, bell ringing, and Eucharistic processions. They showed great teamwork when they were tasked with identifying all of the altar objects by their proper name and learned more in detail about the vestments that the priest wears. The boys attended Mass together each day and learned to pray morning prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours. There was time for food, playing games, and for fraternity amongst our young men. Many thanks to Elias Belton for organizing the training camp and Kelly Belton for chaperoning and taking pictures for us to share with you! We have an incredible group of young men and we are grateful for the service they provide for our parish and to the Lord during the holy sacrifice of the Mass. We are looking forward to seeing our newly trained servers at the altar very soon!

We have celebrated a lineup of Solemnities and Feasts over the past several weeks that included Pentecost, Trinity Sunday, Corpus Christi, The Sacred Heart, and the Immaculate Heart of Mary.
