### JULY 4: ST. ELIZABETH OF PORTUGAL

**PERSEVERE IN DISCIPLESHIP**

Spend some time today with these lines from Ezekiel: "Hard of face and obstinate of heart are they to whom I am sending you. But you shall say to them: Thus says the LORD GOD! And whether they heed or resist — for they are a rebellious house — they shall know that a prophet has been among them." Try placing yourself in this passage as the prophet who has been sent to convert hardened hearts. As missionary disciples, we should resemble this prophet. God has chosen and sent us; He intends to use us as instruments in His divine will and He warns that it won't be an easy task. Like Jesus in today's gospel, we won't always be well-received, but we are called to persevere. It is easy to discuss our faith with like-minded people, but we are called to share it with those who are more resistant. And remember – you are cooperating with God's plan, but you are not the Author of the plan! Plant the seed, and trust that wherever you go, regardless of how you were treated, "they shall know that a prophet has been among them." Pray with this. Ask the Holy Spirit to fill you with the confidence to engage in the difficult work!

**DEAR CLONMELIANS,**

I would like to thank all those who were able to make the open houses after each of the weekend Masses this past weekend. We had great crowds after each Mass and I was very encouraged by your participation. I enjoyed the conversations I had with many of you while looking over the artistic renderings of the new church and hearing your feedback.

For those that were not able to make the open houses, we have posted the new images of the interior of the church on our website along with a digital feedback form. I encourage you to take some time to view the renderings and offer your impressions to help guide the building committee as they continue their work.

As myself and the building committee were listening to your feedback in conversation at the open house many thoughts and suggestions were made that we will discuss further in our future meetings including:

1. Most people liked the noble simplicity of the interior, keeping focus of the sanctuary.
2. Most overwhelmingly liked the coloring of the dark wood ceiling but some expressed a need for more light.
3. The stone on the wall in the sanctuary and throughout the church was popular and overall the colors throughout the church were well received.
4. Many liked that the building maintains its intimate feel with a seating for 350 with an option to have nearly 500 seats when chairs are added in gathering space and transepts.
5. The communion rail was appreciated, with many asking that we use it.
6. Several shared their approval on using carpet under the pews to reduce noise while using tile in the aisles.
7. The tile used in the sanctuary was well received but many voiced their dislike of the 12x12 tile used in the aisles.
8. Several asked about the sound resonance of the building, concerned with noise level and echo. We will be using a sound engineer to address this issue.
9. A few asked if it would be possible to add a choir loft.
10. A few suggested that we inlay a medallion tile at the front of the center aisle, possibly the Celtic cross used on the exterior and window above the baptismal font.

Everyone is still invited to share their thoughts and ideas about the project. At each step of the project it is important that we hear your thoughts and ideas.
