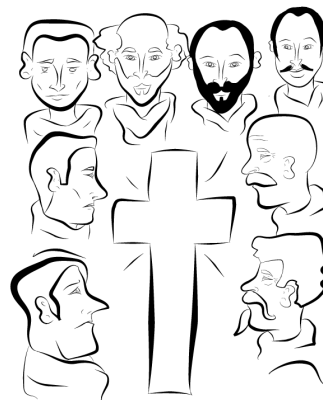

SEP 26: SAINTS ISAAC JOGUES, JOHN DE BREBEUF & COMPANIONS
Isaac, John & their companions (Anthony Daniel, Gabriel Lalement, Charles Gamier, Noel Chabanel, John Lalande & Rene Goupil) were born in France and were Jesuit priests. They volunteered to go to New France (now Ontario) as missionaries to bring the Good News to the Huron people of Canada. For 25 years, they cared for the Huron people, built Churches, schools and shared the Gospel. They learned the Huron language and wrote a catechism book for them. Though many became Christians, many did not trust the missionaries. There were lots of illnesses that came with the people coming from France and many Huron people died. The Huron people believed the missionaries brought these diseases and suffering to their people. Since the missionary priests were helping the Huron people, the Iroquois people hated them. After their many years of mission, Isaac, John and their Companions were captured by the Iroquois and killed. They died as martyrs.

WORKING TOWARD A COMMON GOAL

"...we tried to prevent him because he does not follow us." In today's Gospel, the disciples see a man driving out demons in the name of Jesus, and they ask him to stop because he isn't "one of them." First of all, there is jealousy and rivalry in this comment. As we read last week, there is no room for those traits in the heart of a true disciple. Secondly, they said "he does not follow us." The pronoun us (rather than you) indicates that in some ways, they have elevated themselves to being equal to Jesus. Clearly, they are still struggling with the lesson of "the first shall be last." Jesus settles this by stating that the man should be allowed to continue his work, and that if he isn't against us, then he is for us. Here is an important lesson for you and I! How often do we grow self-righteous in our own piety or our own faith and come to the conclusion that our own discipleship is stronger than another person's? Our goal is unification with all those who are "not against us," regardless of status or denomination. Missionary discipleship gains momentum when we realize we are all working toward a common goal!

DEAR CLONMELIANS,

This past week we welcomed the start of the Fall season. Such transitions help us mark the passing of time while reminding us how quickly it passes. As I reflected on these things I was led to reflect on what we do to prepare ourselves for the end of life and how we honor and pray for those who came before us.

With a cemetery right here on our parish grounds we have a wonderful opportunity to pray for the deceased. Many family members and loved ones remain there awaiting the second coming of Jesus Christ, when their bodies will be raised with Him to the fullness of glory. We are also coming up on All Souls Day on November 2nd, the day we offer special prayer for the dead.

Camping and Praying for the Dead

As a way of engaging in the formation of our traditions of praying for the dead I am inviting families to join me in a night of prayer for those in our cemetery. This will take place as a camp out on the north portion of the cemetery with a campfire near the volleyball court and prayers in the cemetery for the dead. Children of all ages may participate but at least one parent MUST attend as the parish will not be providing supervision of minors.

This event is an opportunity to form your family in the traditions of praying for the dead and a camping experience in a safe and familiar atmosphere.

Things to bring:

- Tent for those in your family (kids MUST tent with their parents)
- Sleeping bag & sleeping pad
- Warm clothing (can get cold at night)
- Food/Camp cooking stove (each family is responsible for making their evening meal)
- Flashlight, headlamp, or lantern

What to expect:

- The parish will provide items for s'mores.
- Campfire pit
- Prayer booklet
- Stories of faith about those who have passed
- Novena every hour in the cemetery for 9 hours (6 PM – 2 AM)
- Activities for kids/families to form them in praying for the dead

I hope you and your children will be able to join us for this fun and prayerful family event. It will take place on **Friday night, October 23rd**. Families can begin setting up their tents any time after 4 PM with our first novena prayers beginning at 6 PM. On Saturday morning we will end the event with Mass together and a hot breakfast.
