## **Building project statistics**

As we collect data for the building project I would like to pass along those numbers to you. Today I'm sharing the number of families and individuals who are registered members of our parish and the trends since 1961, the earliest year we have statistical information on this demographic.

In 1961 (58 years ago) we had 68 families registered in the parish.

In 1994 (25 years ago) we had 173 families registered in the parish.

In 2009 (10 years ago) we had 167 families registered in the parish.

In 2016 we had 207 families registered in the parish.

Currently we have 209 families registered in the parish.

The growth of the parish has not exploded, but has continued to steadily grow over the past 60 years. Projected future growth has not been determined. Those numbers will be shared as we gather them.

We also have (according to October Mass counts) 368 individuals attending Mass each Sunday. This is down slightly from 5 years ago (405). Reasons for the drop in attendance are various and would include who the pastor is, children attending Catholic schools (which draw families toward those parishes), accessibility issues, Mass time availability, and stylistic choices (music, homilies, liturgical choices). Overall, our Mass attendance has been stable, which seems attributable, among others things, to your welcoming and communal atmosphere.
