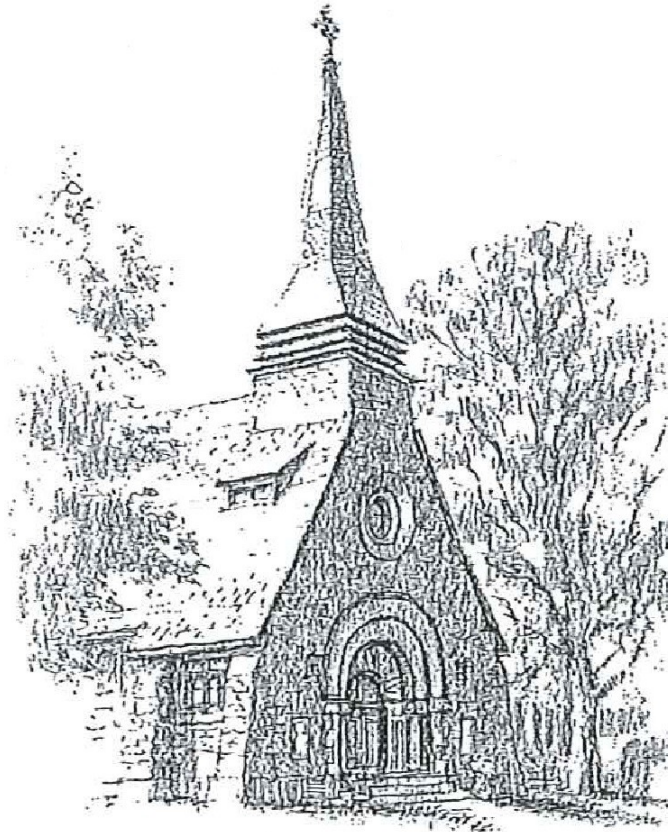

### Regina Coeli

*Regina coeli laetare, allelulia!*

*Quia quem meruisti portare, allelulia*

*Resurrexit sicut dixit, allelulia*

*Ora pro nobis Deum. Allelulia*

O Queen of heaven, rejoice,

For He whom you have merited to bear,

Is risen as He said,

Pray for us to God.

This brief prayer to the Blessed Mother is chanted throughout the Easter season, proclaiming the joy in heaven and on earth in the Resurrection of Christ. But why turn to the Blessed Mother when this feast celebrates the victory of Her Son? It is because Mary, as Mediatrix of all graces, united us to heaven in a unique and maternal way. She is the first of all people to believe in Jesus as the Messiah, and therefore Mother of all believers, making this a family celebration. Who wouldn't congratulate a mother on so great an achievement? Her joy links us to the joy of the angels and saints in heaven, making this a cosmic celebration, a feast for the Communion of Saints.

The Feast of Easter is the center point of the Church's liturgical year. It is the turning point of all human history, for it gives us the knowledge that all does not end in death; through our sharing in the Lord's life through Baptism, we gain a share in His everlasting life.

### SAINT ANSELM, 1033 TO 1109

Indifferent toward religion as a young man, Anselm became one of the Church's greatest theologians and leaders. He received the title "Father of Scholasticism" for his attempt to analyze and illumine the truths of Faith through the aid of reason.

At 15, Anselm wanted to enter a monastery, but was refused acceptance because of his father's opposition. Twelve years later, after careless disinterest in religion and years of worldly living, he finally fulfilled his desire to be a monk. He entered the monastery of Bec in Normandy, was elected prior three years later, and 15 years later, was unanimously chosen abbot. During these years, at the community's request, Anselm began publishing his theological works, comparable to those of Saint Augustine. His best-known work is the book *Cur Deus Homo* ("Why God Became Man").

Against his will, Anselm was appointed archbishop of Canterbury in 1093, at age 60. His appointment was opposed at first by England's King William Rufus and later accepted. Rufus persistently refused to cooperate with efforts to reform the Church. Anselm finally went into voluntary exile until Rufus died in 1100. He was then recalled to England by Rufus' brother and successor, Henry I. His care and concern extended to the very poorest people. Opposing the slave trade, Anselm obtained from the national council at Westminster the passage of a resolution prohibiting the sale of human beings.

### MEMORARE TO ST. JOSEPH
