## **Procedures**

1. The first week of school students will turn in the signed Summer Reading form indicating which books students read. This will count as a test grade.
2. Students will be required to read many selections outside of class and to reread materials that have been read in class on their own.
3. When working in the textbook, students will have a test on each literary selection or group of selections. These will be about once a week.
4. When reading longer works of literature (such as novels or plays), tests will be based on chapters, acts or sections.
5. Projects will be assigned for longer works of literature and for the Poetry Unit of Study.
6. All answers to questions on homework and tests will be written in complete sentences.

## Discipline
