

**March 15, 2020**  
**Third Sunday of Lent**

Dear friends in Christ,

The last two weeks, we reflected on two of the three pillars of our Lenten penitential practices – prayer and almsgiving. This week we take a look at fasting.

Fasting is an ancient ascetical practice of the holy men and women of the Old Testament. Jesus himself fasted and taught that his disciples would fast after his Crucifixion and Ascension into Heaven. When the disciples of John come asking Jesus why he and His disciples do not fast, Jesus answers: "Can the wedding guests mourn while the Bridegroom is with them? The days will come when the Bridegroom is taken from them, then they will fast." (Mt 9:15) These days of Lent are the days when the Bridegroom is taken from us. Fridays, particularly during Lent, are days of fasting and obligatory abstinence from meat. Friday is the day that the Bridegroom of the Church was taken from us, the day our Lord died on the cross. All of Lent is a time for turning from our sin and back to the Bridegroom from whom we have strayed. Through sin, we separate ourselves from Him. Acknowledging our sinfulness, we fast.

Fasting is also a powerful weapon against temptation and evil. In Matthew 17, Jesus' disciples are unable to cast out a demon. Jesus, however, casts it out with a single command. In amazement, his disciples ask: "Why could we not cast it out?" (Mt 17:19) Jesus replies: "Because of your little faith... this kind never comes out except by prayer and fasting." (Mt 17:21) Fasting, accompanied by prayer, leads to greater faith, which leads to spiritual strength against evil. To have true faith, we must first have humility; humility leads us to have faith in God rather than in ourselves. Our stomach rumbles even after missing one meal, exposing our frailty, which leads to the realization that we must rely on God alone. Each craving for what we gave up for Lent is a reminder to place our trust, not in ourselves, but in God.

There are certain obligatory fasts for Catholics. An hour before Mass, we abstain from any food or drink (other than water and medicine). In addition, those ages 18-59 are obliged to fast and abstain from meat on Good Friday and Ash Wednesday; on these days, the maximum food permitted is one full meal and two smaller meals that, together, do not equal a full meal. However, these requirements are the *minimum*; let's not settle for the minimum. Let us each pray about how the Lord wants to increase our faith through fasting this Lent. This could be fasting from certain food, comforts, and/or technology. If we rely on our own strength to sustain us, nothing is possible, but "with God, nothing will be impossible." (Lk 1:37)

**The Fishers of Men Project**

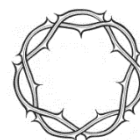
