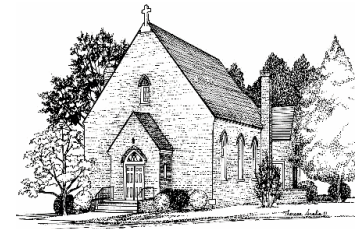

Dear brothers and sisters,

The Archdiocese of Washington is in full thanksgiving mode as we respond to the outpouring of grace upon us this weekend. Saturday was the occasion for the ordination of a priest and several deacons by Archbishop Wilton Gregory.

While only a limited number of folks were able to attend the ceremony, we all were blessed - even if we didn't know it! Let us consider the ways....

Have you ever experienced spontaneous gratitude for the presence and ministry of a priest? I bet you have. And now we have *another* young man who has surrendered his life to the priestly vocation of service to the people of God as a spiritual father. Think of all of the lives the God the Father will be touching thru that young man's life as a priest.

The flood of grace at his ordination on Saturday will seem like a trickle when he looks back years from now upon all of the ways God has used him to touch the souls of innumerable people. May the good Lord give him many years of fruitful service to the Church of Washington.

As a father, one of the fruits of his life as a priest will be the young men whom he will inspire to consider giving their life to Christ as a priest. The grace of his ordination then begins to become exponential as Jesus moves in the lives of others who are called to serve as priestly fathers in the family of God.

It is Father's Day in our nation. In Italy, Father's Day is very fittingly celebrated on the feast of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Virgin Mary. The fatherly parallels between St. Joseph and the priesthood are even more profound than between St. Joseph and biological fathers.

On Saturday, a young man who was ordained became another St. Joseph to the Church, to the Holy Virgin and to souls. The constant concern of Joseph, the virgin spouse of Mary, was the Holy Family. In his fidelity to the gift of celibacy, the new priest will embody the presence of the divine Bridegroom. All of his priestly energies will be lavished upon the Church. The Holy Virgin, the Mother of the Church, continues to extend her maternal solicitude upon God's children. She will depend on her new priest to imitate Joseph - humble, hardworking and holy - on behalf of her children.

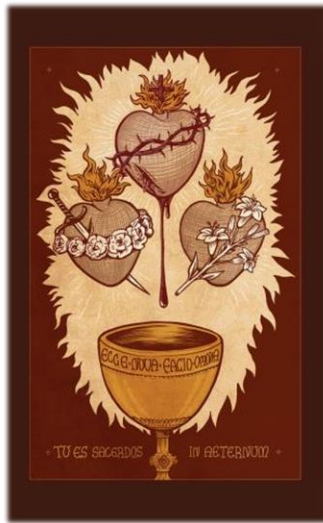

This is a priest's "Sunday" or sabbath rest when he gets a chance for rest, run important errands, and do various activities apart from the usual parish duties. My day off will be on Monday and there will not be a daily Mass at St. Michael's on Mondays. This will go into effect beginning July 12. Monday's schedule for adoration of the Blessed Sacrament may be affected by my day off and I will address these possible changes with the Monday adorers at a later date.

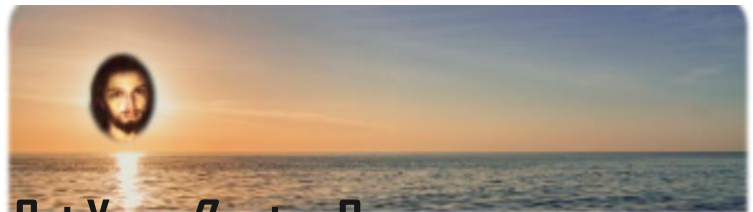
