Dear brothers and sisters,

"Jesus, Mary and Joseph, pray for us!"

Let us reflect on what the prayer of Jesus, Mary and Joseph must have been like. It is certain that they had a profound prayer life, both individually and as a family.

Our prayer is important because it is our line of communication with our family in heaven. As we spend more and more time on our cell phones and other communication devices, our prayer can slip. But St. Francis de Sales has some excellent advice for us: "Everyone of us needs half an hour of prayer each day," remarked St. Francis de Sales, "except when we are busy—then we need an hour." Try to get your half hour of daily prayer. If you cannot do that, then take an hour a day which will slow your life down. This sounds counter intuitive, but it will happen if you try.

St. John Damascene defined prayer as "the raising of one's mind and heart to God or the requesting of good things from God." (see Catechism, no. 2559) Surely, the first object of our prayer is God. But we also call our ongoing relationships with the citizens of heaven by the name of prayer. As Catholics, we are fully aware that those who dwell in the joy of heaven are more interested in our wellbeing than we are ourselves. And so we pray to our guardian angel given to us by God as a unique relationship meant to promote and protect our salvation. We pray also to the saints, especially our Blessed Lady and St. Joseph.

When we call upon Jesus, we are praying to the Lord who made us, who created us to be in relationship with Him now and in the hereafter. It is He, the very Son of God, who is in constant union with the Father and the Holy Spirit. Our family prayer of the Rosary places us in the immaculate heart of Mary where she contemplates the wonders of God. Turning to St. Joseph in prayer is to imitate Jesus, the divine Child, who would call Joseph's name with such love and respect.

The prayerful recollection of the Sacred Heart of Jesus would draw the pure hearts of Mary and Joseph into the sweet communion of family prayer. To enter the home of Nazareth is to be immersed in a cloud of the Divine Presence where minds and hearts are raised in mutual love and self-gift.


Blessing of Our New Sugar Maple Trees

A Note from our New Pastor: Father Cusick

God's blessings upon you and your family! I want to take an opportunity to introduce myself and let you know that I am looking forward to being your new pastor. Soon, we will have the great grace of gathering together to celebrate the Holy Eucharist at St. Michael's and St. Dominic's churches.

I grew up in Melbourne, Florida and have two brothers. Throughout grade school and high school, I participated in a large Catholic community and enjoyed my Catholic upbringing. I graduated from the University of Miami, Coral Gables, Florida with a degree in psychology. For one year, I worked as a research intern at the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, Maryland and focused mainly on childhood development and family studies. For seminary, I attended Mount St. Mary's Seminary, Emmitsburg, MD and was ordained a priest of Jesus Christ on June 15, 2013.

Before joining you in person, I also want to share with you a slight change in the daily Mass schedule. As many of you know, a priest takes one day off each week. This is a priest's "Sunday" or sabbath rest when he gets a chance for rest, run important errands, and do various activities apart from the usual parish duties. My day off will be on Monday and there will not be a daily Mass at St. Michael's on Mondays. This will go into effect beginning July 12. Monday's schedule for adoration of the Blessed Sacrament may be affected by my day off and I will address these possible changes with the Monday adorers at a later date.

I want to thank Father Flum for his wonderful leadership and dedication to the spiritual and temporal needs of St. Michael's and St. Dominic's churches. I am also grateful for the prayer cards that many of you received and humbly request that you continue praying for a smooth transition for Fr. Flum and me. Again, I am looking forward to meeting you all soon and please know of my prayers.
