## Father's Column

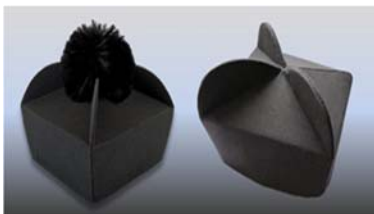
### **The Biretta:**

Routinely, priests who don the biretta (or black square hat) at Mass are asked about its history, significance, or its return after a near ubiquitous hiatus since the 1960s. Let's consider each of these questions.

The origin of the biretta, like that of many garments that span the centuries, is a bit murky. First written references to clerical hat wear are somewhat vague and emerge in the tenth century. "Biretta" likely comes to us by means of the Italian word "beretta." The Latin word used is "birretum," meaning hood, likely from "birrus," meaning "hooded cloak," and ultimately from the Greek "pyrrus." Originally, the biretta looked more like a skull cap, but developed "wings" by indentations made with fingers in its placement or removal. Some nations, such as Spain and its colonies, developed four-winged birettas. The Romans, however, maintained three. Custom also varies regarding the inclusion of a tassel. The biretta's significance is largely academic; although, again, the history is limited. Its similarity in appearance to the squared and tasseled graduation cap seen at any high school or university bears testimony to its academic connection. For ecclesiastics, two types of birettas exist, namely liturgical & academic. Academic birettas are granted upon completion of an advanced degree. Different areas of study have their own color piping sewn in, such as green for canon law studies. The completion of a doctorate is indicated with a fourth wing.

Normally, however, people see liturgical birettas that lack any academic distinction, if they see them at all. Cardinals wear solid red; bishops magenta; monsignors black with magenta piping and tassel; priests black. Even seminarians may wear black birettas.

Lastly, their recent history. In 1962, the biretta, previously required, became optional for use at Holy Mass. Amidst the fervor of change in the mid-to-late sixties, many priests stopped wearing them. The younger clergy, however, in a desire for deep and historically rooted priestly identity, found even in the seemingly smaller details, are opting for their return.
