Father's Column

Why Latin?

Next week, clergy and religious from around the country will gather at St. Joseph's College Seminary outside Charlotte for my ninth annual *Veterum Sapientia* conference. This week-long program is conducted exclusively in Latin, including lectures, small group discussions, casual conversations, and games.

The program's purpose is to respond to Pope John XXIII's 1962 Apostolic Constitution *Veterum Sapientia* promulgated for the restoration and promotion of the study of Latin in seminaries. Many think Pope John was the pope to jettison Latin from the life of the Church, but his intentions were the opposite: "And We also...are fully determined to restore this language to its position of honor, and to do all We can to promote its study and use. The employment of Latin has recently been contested in many quarters, and many are asking what the mind of the Apostolic See is in this matter. We have therefore decided to issue the timely directives contained in this document, so as to ensure that the ancient and uninterrupted use of Latin be maintained and, where necessary, restored."

But why Latin? On one hand, we consider, as the Pope said, its "ancient and uninterrupted use." But why did the Church adopt Latin, as opposed to another language? One could point to Providence, namely that Christ was born under the first roman emperor and the fact that Peter concluded his career as shepherd in the Latin-speaking capital of Rome. However, the Latin language itself has three qualities Popes Pius XI and John XXIII identify as particularly suited for the Church.

Firstly, Latin is universal. It is home to no nation, yet embraces all peoples. Second, Latin is immutable or unchanging. Precisely as a "dead language," words do not change meaning over time. Consider the difficulty in reading *Beowulf* and other early English works. Latin provides unity over time. Lastly, Latin is non-vernacular and sacred.

The Church, her mission, her doctrine, and her language, too, are universal, unchanging, and sacred. People ask whether learning Latin is still helpful in the 21st Century. In an age when people are tempted to think the truth changes from one country to another or from one century to the next, we clerics need to be formed by a language that is universal and immutable, embracing all nations and centuries. In a time when some wish to reduce the Church's heavenly mission to something worldly like that of the world's largest NGO, we need a sacred language to keep us oriented on heaven.
