
JMI Summer Camp 2020

Covid-19 Protocol

Due to the current health situation we have had to make several changes to this year's JMI Camp. This year only, we will host just one Boys Camp and one Girls Camp, with a limit of 36 campers. If the North Dakota guidelines change before Camp begins then we will adjust to the new set of guidelines accordingly and increase the number of participants if possible. Because of the limited number of participants, the age range for this year's campers will be **11-17 years old (by July 6th) with no exceptions made**. We have implemented this protocol in accordance with North Dakota's Smart Restart Guidelines. We will do everything we can to maintain a safe and healthy environment for all our campers. **If you are unsure, in any way, about sending your child(dren) we ask that you refrain from sending them this year.** If you have any questions, please contact Father Joseph Christensen, FMI.

Check-In:

We will have an extended time for people to arrive at Camp to allow for staggered check in. Please park at the St. Josephs Hall 15613 County Road 15, just east of the St. Gianna Home. We ask that only one family at a time approach the check in table.

We ask that parents go with their child(dren) to the check in table where we will first ask a series of health screening questions and take your child's temperature. Then we will check temperatures, and any above 100.4 F will be turned away. After this, parents will say goodbye and return to their vehicle.

We ask that your camper have a set of clean clothes, that has been in a sealed bag for two days, to bring to Camp.

Your child will then sanitize their hands and enter the facility bathroom and change into the sealed clothes they brought with them to Camp. They will place their old clothes into the bag they brought the new set in, and then that bag will be sprayed and left under their cot for the duration of Camp.

All possessions that your child brings will be sanitized upon check in and set aside until after the campers have had dinner that evening.

Hygiene:

Hand sanitizer will be available throughout the premises, and all are encouraged to use it often.

Campers will be required to wash their hands for at least 20 seconds, in accordance with ND guidelines, before each meal/snack time.

A sanitized water bottle with your camper's name on it will be given to them, and we ask that they do not share this bottle with anyone else for the duration of Camp.

Masks: Will not be provided to campers nor are we requiring campers to wear a mask. If you would like your child to wear a mask, please send one with them to Camp.

Campers are encouraged, if possible, to bring hand sanitizer, a package of paper towel and/or toilet paper. These will also be sanitized upon arrival.

Campers will be required to sanitize upon entering and exiting each facility.

Bathrooms and common areas will be sanitized throughout each day.

Masses and Holy Hours

Masses or prayers at Saint Stanislaus will adhere to the guidelines of the Diocese of Fargo.

The Bus:

The bus will be thoroughly sanitized before and after each use.

Any parent who is not comfortable with having their child attend the daily pool trip will be able to have their camper stay in Warsaw and take part in the games and activities we have during that time each day.

The Grafton Community Pool is required to follow North Dakota Smart Restart Guidelines as well to ensure the health and safety of all who utilize the facility.

Mealtimes/Snack times:

All meals and snack will be distributed by staff on an individual basis to maintain health guidelines.

State health guidelines will be followed in meal preparation and service.

Other:

Due to the current circumstances, the JMI Campers will not be able to go on the trip to Northern Air Family Fun Center this year. The campers will only be going to the pool in Grafton but will otherwise not leave Warsaw during the Camp.

We are also not allowing parents to attend the beginning or ending Mass/award ceremony. We will be taking photographs throughout, and they will be posted to the FMI website.

For pickup, the campers will bring all their stuff and go meet their parents where they park at St. Joseph Hall and depart from there.

We will be monitoring the camper's health constantly during Camp. If at any point during Camp a camper feels unwell, and has any symptoms consistent with Covid-19, they will be immediately separated from the rest of the Camp and their parents will be contacted to bring their child(ren) home as soon as possible.

Dates and times:

Girls Camp: Monday July 6th-Saturday July 11th

Please drop off your daughter July 6th anytime between 10 and 11:30 am.

Girls Camp will end on July 11th, please pick up your daughter anytime between 3 and 4 pm.

This year the Camps will not begin and end together to give the staff adequate time to clean and sanitize before the Boy's Camp begins.

Boys Camp: Sunday July 12th-Friday July 17th

Please drop off your son July 12th anytime between 12 and 1:30 pm.

*Please have your son attend Sunday Mass prior to arriving at Camp as we will not be having a separate Mass on the 12th for the Boy's Camp. St. Stanislaus, in Warsaw, has a 10:30 am Mass if you would like to attend.

Boys should be picked up between 3 and 4 pm on July 17th.

Given these new dates and times, even though you may have already registered, we ask that you officially register now so that we may have a more accurate number of campers.
