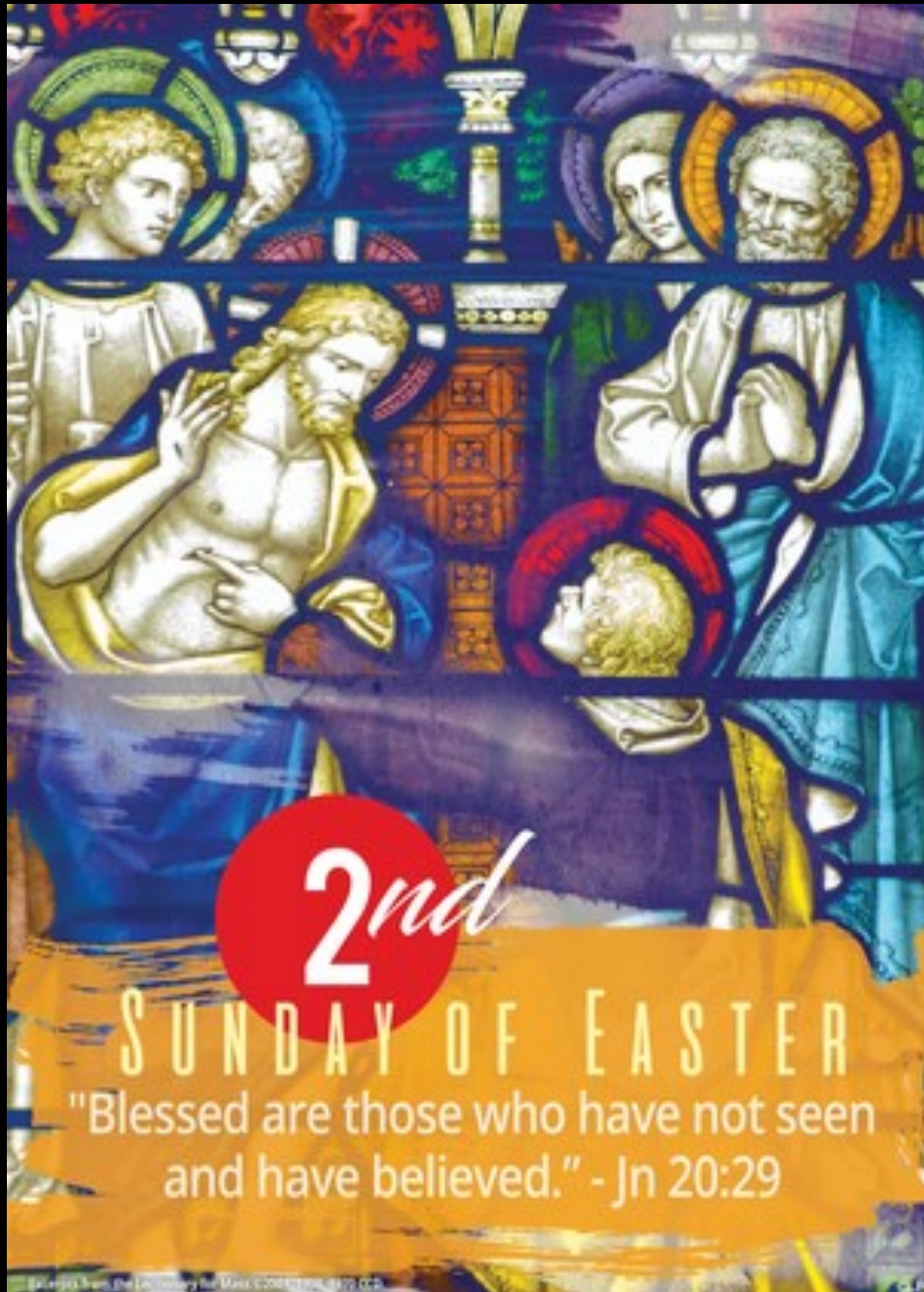

Jesus Christ, heal us.

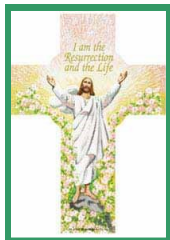
