Marymount Scholarship (must attend a Catholic college). Due in Diocesan office by July 1.

St. Frances Cabrini Scholarship (available for any student attending a Catholic college or serving in a ministry in a public institution). Application deadline is May 1.

USING HOLY WATER

Holy Water is the oldest part of the Church, beginning with Baptism.

1. Bless yourself. Use holy water daily; keeping holy water in your home is a great idea. Keep it by the door to make certain you never leave home without it.
2. Bless your house. Your home is the domestic Church and is in need of spiritual protection.
3. Bless your family. Make the Sign of the Cross over your spouse and/or children and bless with holy water.
4. Bless your workspace. Not only for spiritual protection on the work front but also to sanctify your daily work for the glory of God.
5. Bless your car. Holy water applied to your car keeps you safe from harm's way when used in faith and trust in God.
6. Bless your vegetable garden. Using holy water to bless plants used for family's sustenance show reliance on God's grace.
7. Bless your farm, your tractors and other equipment, bless your acreage. In case of storms, sprinkle holy water out the door and ask God to take the storm away – to turn hail into rain, calm the storm and to protect your family and neighbors.
8. Bless the sick. Bless their living space as well.
9. Bless your pets. Pets are loved companions and often provide great service and can be blessed because all creation has the end of giving glory to God. Also applies to livestock and farm animals that provide labor and nourishment to humans.
