RENEW & REBUILD UPDATE

Since the completion of the pledge portion of the campaign, approximately \$383,238 has been paid. There are however, a substantial number of pledges on which payments either are not being received on a timely basis, or no payment has been received at all. However, of 233 pledges, no payment has been made. Please insure that if you made and if your current situation is such that you can make payments on time, please do so.

INCREASED GIVING

The only source of income for the parish is the generosity of each of the parishioners. The support of the ministries and activities throughout the year and the costs of maintaining the beauty of our Church and grounds are managed and made possible by these contributions. Over the past few months during this year, there has been a noticeable decline in the amounts collected during the Sunday Masses. While there is a constant and concerted effort to control costs and make the best use of the available funds, expenses associated with our utilities, our maintenance and our payments to the Archdiocese tend to increase, while our collections are either remaining the same or slightly declining. This pattern can be offset by small increases in the Sunday mass donations from everyone who is attending. With average attendance ranging from 750 to 1200 people, an increase as low as \$2 per person can have a significant and very positive effect, as we continue to strive to keep the parish of St. Joseph and St. Boniface, a Beacon of Light, Faith and Hope in this community. We truly have come this far by faith, supported by everyone's generosity. Thank you!

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

I use GPS wherever I go, and it serves me well most of the time. However, sometimes it leads me to a place that does not exist. Then there are those times when I am about to turn, and the man inside my phone shouts out, "GPS signal lost!" or "Rerouting!" The problem is, when the area is unfamiliar to me, I have no choice but to listen. I could try to get where I am going by simple intuition or by pulling over to look at a paper map, but I don't trust my sense of direction. And I haven't bought a paper map in close to a decade!

Prayer can serve as a compass, and it connects us to a companion for the journey. Stewardship living is impossible without prayer. If we count on our own will and believe we can become fruitful without daily contact with the Divine, we can find ourselves looking for directions more than moving toward a destination. God, through prayer, will help us see all we have as a gift. God, through prayer, will lead us away from materialism and selfishness and toward freedom and generosity.

Basta un gesto pequeño, una caricia: 'Bueno, adiós, hasta mañana'. Y mañana se comienza de nuevo". ¿Qué te anima de estos consejos? ¿Qué harás por tu familia actualmente?

CHRISTMAS MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Espero que este mensaje de Navidad te encuentre bien y en buena salud. Alégrate, regocíjate Emanuel ha venido a ti "Oh Israel". El verdadero mensaje de la Navidad se encuentra en el Evangelio de Lucas, capítulo dos, en el versículo quince. Allí tenemos el relato del nacimiento de Jesús. En la siguiente Escritura, tenemos a los pastores que van a Belén. En el verdadero mensaje de Navidad, los pastores vinieron a ver esta cosa que los ángeles dijeron que había llegado a pasar. "Que a vosotros nace en la Ciudad de David, un Salvador que es Cristo el Señor". Ellos vinieron y vieron, luego salieron glorificando y alabando a Dios, contando a otros lo que habían visto y oído. La alabanza del hombre y la adoración de Dios por la revelación de Su gloria esa noche no ha cesado. Ni la duda del escéptico; el escarnio del escarnecedor; las críticas de la profesión; la apatía del público; burla de la multitud; la blasfemia del pagano; la espada del verdugo ni las mentiras del diablo, han disminuido la esperanza que nació esa noche. 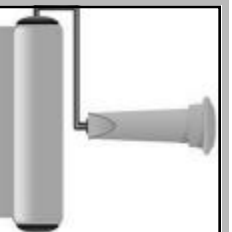
