RENEW & REBUILD UPDATE

Since the completion of the pledge portion of the campaign, approximately \$383,238 has been paid. There are however, a substantial number of pledges on which payments either are not being received on a timely basis, or no payment has been received at all. However, of 233 pledges, no payment has been made. Please insure that if you made and if your current situation is such that you can make payments on time, please do so.

INCREASED GIVING

The only source of income for the parish is the generosity of each of the parishioners. The support of the ministries and activities throughout the year and the costs of maintaining the beauty of our Church and grounds are managed and made possible by these contributions. Over the past few months during this year, there has been a noticeable decline in the amounts collected during the Sunday Masses. While there is a constant and concerted effort to control costs and make the best use of the available funds, expenses associated with our utilities, our maintenance and our payments to the Archdiocese tend to increase, while our collections are either remaining the same or slightly declining. This pattern can be offset by small increases in the Sunday mass donations from everyone who is attending. With average attendance ranging from 750 to 1200 people, an increase as low as \$2 per person can have a significant and very positive effect, as we continue to strive to keep the parish of St. Joseph and St. Boniface, a Beacon of Light, Faith and Hope in this community. We truly have come this far by faith, supported by everyone's generosity. Thank you!

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

*God's glory, now, is kindled gentler than candlelight under the rafters of a barn: Eternal Peace is sleeping in the hay, And Wisdom's born in secret in a straw-roofed stable.**

When I was younger, I wrote music to and recorded Thomas Merton's poem, "Epiphany Carol." If you have never read it, search it out on the internet. Merton's words are profound and paint a picture of the awesomeness of Jesus, the newborn King of Kings, lying in a simple straw bed. The shepherds and Wise Men are drawn to pay homage to the One who has been born above all others and brings with him hope for a broken world.

As Merton correctly points out, the gifts we are called to bring to this baby and lay at his feet are our prayers and penances, next to those gifts of worldly wealth. What is it that you have to bring to the stable on this feast of the Epiphany of the Lord? Unless those prayers and penances lead to a new way of living, our gifts will be void of meaning. What we lay before him speaks to the change in us that he has given to us by his birth. Our daily stewardship is resembled in those gifts. If we are to truly echo the kingdom of God in our lives and actions, what we ultimately offer to him is no less than our entire selves. This baby will give his entire self for us, and his work must continue through our hands and feet.

*While we unnumbered children of the wicked centuries, Come after with our penances and prayers, And lay them down in the sweet-smelling hay Beside the wise men's golden jars.**

CHRISTMAS MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Le vrai message de Noël se trouve dans l'Évangile de Luc, chapitre deux, au quinzième verset. Là nous avons le récit de la naissance de Jésus. Dans l'Écriture suivante, nous avons les bergers qui vont à Bethléem. Dans le vrai message de Noël, les bergers sont venus voir cette chose que les anges ont dit accompli ». Dans la cité de David, est né un Sauveur qui est le Christ, le Seigneur. Ils sont venus et ont vu, puis ils ont glorifié et loué Dieu, disant aux autres ce qu'ils avaient vu et entendu. La louange de l'homme et l'adoration de Dieu pour la révélation de sa gloire cette nuit-là n'ont pas cessé. Ni le doute du sceptique; Le mépris du moqueur; Les critiques des professionnels;

L'apathie du public; L'ironie de la foule; Le blasphème du païen; L'épée du bourreau; Les mensonges du diable, n'ont pu diminuer l'espoir qui est né cette nuit-là. 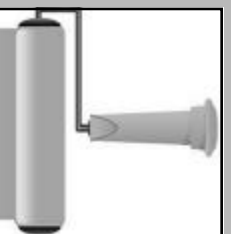
