RENEW & REBUILD UPDATE

Since the completion of the pledge portion of the campaign, approximately \$383,238 has been paid. There are however, a substantial number of pledges on which payments either are not being received on a timely basis, or no payment has been received at all. However, of 233 pledges, no payment has been made. Please insure that if you made and if your current situation is such that you can make payments on time, please do so.

INCREASED GIVING

The only source of income for the parish is the generosity of each of the parishioners. The support of the ministries and activities throughout the year and the costs of maintaining the beauty of our Church and grounds are managed and made possible by these contributions. Over the past few months during this year, there has been a noticeable decline in the amounts collected during the Sunday Masses. While there is a constant and concerted effort to control costs and make the best use of the available funds, expenses associated with our utilities, our maintenance and our payments to the Archdiocese tend to increase, while our collections are either remaining the same or slightly declining.

This pattern can be offset by small increases in the Sunday mass donations from everyone who is attending. With average attendance ranging from 750 to 1200 people, an increase as low as \$2 per person can have a significant and very positive effect, as we continue to strive to keep the parish of St. Joseph and St. Boniface, a Beacon of Light, Faith and Hope in this community. We truly have come this far by faith, supported by everyone's generosity. Thank you!

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

"Lessons from Baptizing a Frog"

I used to lead an RCIA session on baptism, where I would bring in my Kermit the Frog toy from when I was a child and pretend to baptize it. It was a session I especially made sure I led when we had children preparing for Easter sacraments. You would think Kermit would have become super holy having been baptized so many times, year after year. But, if he had been real, he would not have been any holier due to multiple baptisms than he was after the first baptism. He couldn't be re-baptized.

When Jesus came to John for baptism, he transformed the baptism of repentance that John was practicing into a baptism of redemption. And although we are called to repentance over and over in our life, redemption comes to us only once. We cannot get baptized again in the Jordan or Sea of Galilee because of romantic notions, or come into the Catholic Church by a second baptism so we can start all over. Too many of us take that moment for granted. Yes, you may have been baptized as an infant. But much time has passed since then, and you can work to understand the impact that it had on your life. We sometimes look for a good time to begin living a stewardship way of life. However, that time already passed, and God has been waiting. We are called to reflect on our baptism and respond to the call it has placed on our lives. We can respond and be disciples, or we can be like Kermit the Frog, always searching for a new start that never comes.

LIVING THE LITURGY: INSPIRATION OF THE WEEK

On the cusp of fame, power, or influence, would you turn it down? Today's Gospel again features John the Baptist. Controversial but popular, John has gathered quite a group of followers. He has disciples. People come from near and far to be baptized by him. Pharisees and government leaders are drawn to his preaching. If John was another man, a lesser man, he would have claimed his own greatness. Instead, John the Baptist is a witness to humility.

"The next day he saw Jesus coming towards him and said, 'Behold the Lamb of God ... he is the one of whom I said, "A man is coming after me who ranks ahead of me."... the reason why I came baptizing with water was that he might be made known.'" Rather than point to himself, John points to Christ. John could have grasped at what he had accumulated. He could have seen Jesus as a Messianic competitor. Instead, John knows who he is. Because John knows who Jesus is. "I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God."



WHY DO WE DO THAT?

QUESTION:

Why do Catholics baptize infants, while some other Christian denominations wait until adulthood?

ANSWER:

To understand when we baptize, it's important to know what baptism is. Baptism removes original sin, and we are reborn into the family of God, adopted as His sons and daughters. We become joint heirs with Christ and sharers in his mission. Early on, baptism was given immediately upon

personal conversion, such as the three thousand baptized at Pentecost. Some Christian churches today emphasize baptism specifically as personal conversion. As such, they would not baptize young children who have not yet consciously chosen to follow Christ. As the Church slowly grew, whole households were baptized together upon the deep conversion of one of the leaders (Acts 16). From this evidence, we can surmise that may have included children who were just beginning to hear the Christian message.

This would not have been uncommon, especially for Jewish converts. Circumcision marked entrance into the Old Covenant for men. This occurred, without the express consent of the infants, to male children eight days after their birth.

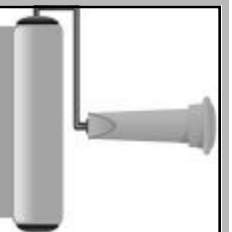

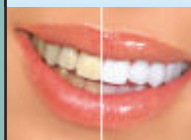
