World Mission Sunday—October 18

At the initiative of Pape Pius XI in 1926, the second last Sunday during October became known as World Mission Sunday. Catholics throughout the world are invited to pray for and give to the missions. The collection is organized by the Pontifical Missions Society. The funds collected assist some 1,250 mission diocese under the responsibility of the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples. As agreed by the Holy See and the Bishops of Canada, a portion of the Canadian contributions to the collection will continue to be used to assist six dioceses in Northern Canada which for many years had also been under the jurisdiction of the Congregation.
