


The Sunday Missal for 2021 have arrived. If you are currently attending mass from home and would like to receive one please contact Kathy.

Live in harmony with one another

In times of uncertainty or stress, tempers can shorten, perspectives narrow, and peace suffers. It is important to remember that Jesus came to bring love and unity. His followers are asked to do the same.

“The rich and the poor meet together; the Lord is the maker of them all” (Proverbs 22:2)—embrace diversity, don’t just tolerate it. Different as we are, we are all made in God’s image and likeness. There is great diversity in the communion of saints.



“Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another” (1 John 4:11)—as children of God, all humans were created with inherent dignity that we are required to acknowledge. Trying to understand others’ perspectives is the best way to realize the impact of our actions on them.

“Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God” (Matthew 5:9)—a steady diet of violent entertainment and media helps us become comfortable with violence and to see people as characters rather than humans. Instead, live with peace and pray for victims of violence.

“And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts” (Colossians 3:15). This means we have to make the choice to trust God’s promises (letting His peace rule) or to rely on ourselves and reject the peace He offers.
