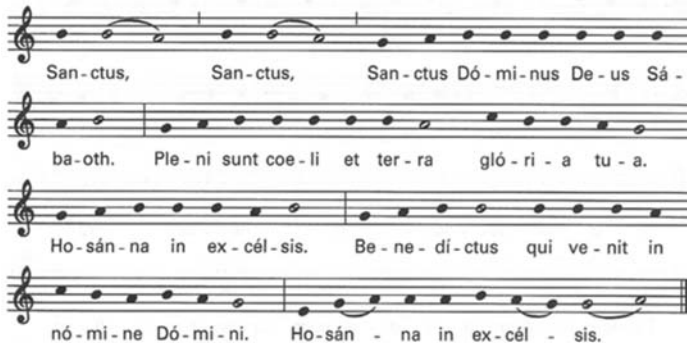

## Second Sunday of Lent



**CHANGE.** Lent is all about change and change is usually not easy. In order to change we have to leave something behind. Today we hear about a very old man who decides to answer God's call. Abram experiences a tremendous amount of change when he leaves everything behind, risking it all for God's promise.

Jesus changes, is transfigured, right before the eyes of his disciples. The Lenten scriptures issue the call for us to change, to be transfigured, so that we, too, will soon share in the glory of God. What is it that the Lord is asking us to leave behind? Are we willing to take the risk for the promise made by God? These questions are at the heart of the Lenten journey of conversion.

- If you are like most of us, we go about our busy lives ignoring those around us. During Lent, make more eye contact, smile more often and say "good morning". What an easy thing to do to bring more joy to the world!
- Every week, put a couple of dollars in the Poor Box in the Narthex.
- Attend Stations of the Cross on Friday evenings.
- Bring an extra can of food for Care & Share.
- Buy some underwear or socks and put them in the Catholic Charities pull-out bin in Vollkommer Bell Tower. They will go directly to the homeless/people getting out of prison.
- Donate that winter coat you did not wear this year, so someone else might benefit. Put any clothing donations in the Catholic Charities pull-out bin.
- Give up a lunch, and donate that money in the collection basket.
- Say a prayer for a faithful departed that you haven't thought about in a while.
- Volunteer at Columbia Food Not Bombs, who feed the homeless on Sundays at Finlay Park.

You get the idea! Something simple to brighten someone else's day! Try it - someone might smile back!

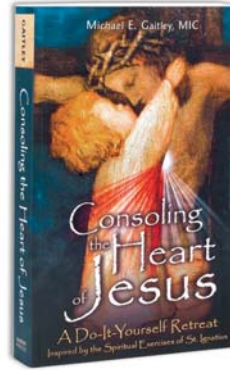

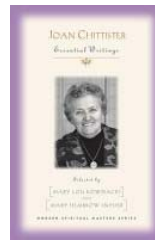
