EUCHARIST ADORATION

Monday-Wednesday from 5:00 – 9:00

PASTOR'S NOTES: Jesus uses this week the image of a sparrow to show God's great love for us and the care God has for all of his creation. He is encouraging his disciples to have no fear as they are being sent out on mission, even though he said, "Behold, I send you out as sheep in the midst of wolves" (Matthew 10:16 RSV). He adds some verses later, "Are not two sparrows sold for a small coin? Yet not one of them falls to the ground without your father's knowledge. Even all the hairs on your head are counted" (Mt 10:29-31 NABRE). Good farmers are stewards of God's creation. Sometimes as kids we used to try to shoot barn swallows with our BB gun, but if we ever got one, we had this inherent sense in us, probably because of our parents, that the bird should not be wasted. We called the cats who were always hungry. It seemed the mice in the barn were not always enough to keep them satiated. Dad was very careful about protecting the soil and that is why he always rotated crops and hated to leave ruts in his black soil so that the clay intermingled with the "richest soil in the world." He never liked it if we stayed in the field too long when it started to rain and brought that beautiful soil out on the road throwing mud chunks everywhere. Eight miles away we farmed a quarter of land that was sandy and had a few hills. He always tried to farm it in a way that it would not blow. Stewardship of the land and all of God's creation has been an important part

of Catholic church teaching for many years. We know that all of God's people, in the city as well as the country, are dependent upon the food that is produced from the land. Even though the church supports the principle of private property, the church also proclaims that we are stewards of the land for future generations. Pope Francis has had, from the beginning of his papacy, a care for God's people and God's creation. May 24, 2015 he wrote the encyclical "Laudato Si". And he pulls no punches. The first two paragraphs of his encyclical are the following: 1. "LAUDATO SI, mi' Signore" – "Praise be to you, my Lord". *In the words of this beautiful canticle, Saint Francis of Assisi reminds us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us. "Praise be to you, my Lord, through our Sister, Mother Earth, who sustains and governs us, and who produces various fruit with coloured flowers and herbs".*[1]

2. *This sister now cries out to us because of the harm we have inflicted on her by our irresponsible use and abuse of the goods with which God has endowed her. We have come to see ourselves as her lords and masters, entitled to plunder her at will. The violence present in our hearts, wounded by sin, is also reflected in the symptoms of sickness evident in the soil, in the water, in the air and in all forms of life. This is why the earth herself, burdened and laid waste, is among the most abandoned and maltreated of our poor; she "groans in travail" (Rom. 8:22). We have forgotten that we ourselves are dust of the earth (cf. Gen 2:7); our very bodies are made up of her elements, we breathe her air and we receive life and refreshment from her waters. Jesus sends us out with message that*

is not always received well by others because it is often challenging. The message of protecting all of God's creation, because it is God's work of art and all future human life is dependent upon its protection, is something that not everyone accepts well. Jesus, however, starts out this gospel with strong words, "Fear no one" (Mt 10:26). Jesus is the one who sends us to reveal God's great love and what is sin, or that which is contrary to God's love.
