STEWARDSHIP MOMENT: July 5th

"For my yoke is easy, and my burden light." - MATTHEW 11:30

When we think of being good stewards, we may think that God is asking too much of us when He calls us to generously share our time, talent and treasure. However, we must remember that we are not "owners" of anything, we are merely "stewards" of the gifts God has given us. All He is asking is that we give back a small portion, in gratitude, of what He has already given to us.

THOUGHT OF THE WEEK:

The story is told of a little boy who had a bad temper. His Father gave him a bag of nails and told him that every time he lost his temper, he must hammer a nail into the wood fence out back. The first day the boy had driven 28 nails into the fence. Over the next few weeks, as he learned to control his anger, the number of nails hammered daily gradually dwindled down. He discovered it was easier to hold his temper than to drive nails into the fence. Finally, the day came when the boy didn't lose his temper anymore. He told his father about it and the wise father suggested that the boy now pull out one nail for each day that he was able to hold his temper. The days passed, and the young boy was finally able to tell his father that all the nails were gone. The father took his son by the hand and led him to the fence. He said, "You have done well, my son, but look at the holes in the fence. The fence will never be the same. When you say things in anger --- you leave scars just like the holes in this fence. PASTOR'S NOTES This Sunday's gospel has been a source of growth for me for a long time. When I first went to seminary in 1981 at Cardinal Muench Seminary (CMS), we were challenged to pick a scripture that we could sit with for awhile. I had had a conversion experience at a Holy Spirit conference which had led me to consider the priesthood, so in the second year of study at Science School in Wahpeton I began reading the Bible. That was the only time I read the Bible from cover to cover. When we were challenged to pick a scripture to sit with, the passage for this Sunday came to mind from somewhere back in my memory. For me this passage was a "comfort" passage. "Come to me... I will give you rest." I had no idea how much one passage from the Bible could affect me over the years. I want to share a few things I have learned from this passage in the last 39 years. The Lord of heaven and earth has revealed things to "little ones" but hid them from "the wise and the learned." It really does take the humility of little ones to learn the basics. One of the basics is faith. First of all faith is "not seeing," as St. Paul says, and yet believing: "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen" (RSV Hebrews 11:1). It certainly does take a certain trust that God will provide, the kind of trust that children have in their mom or dad that all will be well as long as their parents are holding them. "The wise and the learned" might have to

study the intelligence of their parents, look at their history of care, and will still feel anxious because of all the unknowns that could happen. The "little ones" simply trust their mom or dad. There are certainly many possibilities for the future of the world. We could imagine all kinds of horrible possibilities. However, if we trust in the goodness of the one who created the heavens and the earth and who would go so far as suffer and die for us, we will have a certain peace because that God is holding us. We could fall into an abyss, but that God would hold us. Jesus continues by saying, "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest" (Mt 11:28). We go to him in prayer and find rest. There was someone who once said that he woke up with so much to do that it unnerved him and caused him deep anxiety. In the end he said that since he had so much to do, he had to go to pray otherwise he would get nothing done. God is the power source we plug into. If we have to go a long way and many places, we had better fill up with gas first. Jesus goes on to say, "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light." (Mt 11:29-30). If we go to the one who made us, he will give us to what he designed us to do and it will be easy. Some people have the ability to fix a toaster in no time and enjoy doing it. Others of us would be totally frustrated trying to do it and we would probably end up with a pile of parts in the end. What are we called to do in the way of building the kingdom? What work is ours for this short life-time? The best one to tell us is the one who made heaven and earth and us too. Fr. Tim
