**"FRIENDS OF CHIMBOTE" COLLECTION:**

Thank you all for responding to my challenge to match my June salary for the poor of Peru. Here is a recap: The Friends of Chimbote informed us that they were going to different houses to deliver food, because the country was in a lock down on account of the Corona Virus crisis. The problem, however, is that poor live from day to day on their meager incomes and they do not have extra in the food in their pantries. We normally take a Holy Thursday collection for the Friends of Chimbote but that did not happen because of our own shutdown on account of the Pandemic. Our Peru collection raised \$9,985 between both parishes St. Charles and St. Marys and my June salary. Last week we heard Jesus tell his disciples, "You give them something to eat." We brought what we had to Jesus, he blessed it, and we **did** give them something to eat! Well done!!! Jesus said, "The poor you will always have with you." And Jesus took the part of the poor.

**PASTOR'S NOTES**

On behalf of Jesus who took the part of the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger, the naked, the sick and the prisoners, in the last judgment, Mt 25, I would like to thank all the people who joined in my "June Salary Challenge." Someone from St. Mary's gave another \$100 so now the amount that went to the poor of Chimbote between the two parishes is \$10,095. May God bless us as we bring what we have to feed the hungry 1000s... There is more than one story of Jesus feeding the multitudes in Matthew by using the meager amount that the disciples had. We do not read the second story in Matthew chapter 15, but it has a similar pattern to the story in chapter 14. To refresh your memory on August 2<sup>nd</sup> we heard the story of the Feeding of the Five Thousand men (not counting the women and children). The disciples wanted Jesus to dismiss the crowds but Jesus flat out

told them, "There is no need for them to go away; give them some food yourselves." The disciples had protested that five loaves and two fish is all they had. Jesus told his disciples to bring them to him. "Taking the five loaves and the two fish," and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing, broke the loaves and gave them to the disciples who in turn gave them to the crowds" (Mt 14:19). In chapter 14 there are twelve baskets left over. Remember that number is a number of fullness, think of the twelve tribes and twelve apostles. Then in Matthew 15, the disciples have a similar situation before them. Jesus tells his disciples that he has compassion on this hungry multitude. Again they basically say that they can do nothing in the face of such a huge crowd, this time 4000 men, apart from the women and children. They tell Jesus, "Where are we to get bread enough in the desert to feed so great a crowd" (Mt 15:33, RSV). They forgot their lesson about how the Israelites were fed by God in the desert in the time of Moses. Jesus asked the disciples to assess how much food they have; 7 loaves and a couple fish is the answer. Once again Jesus takes what they have, gives thanks, breaks the bread and then gives it to the disciples so that they could give it to the crowds. This time Jesus "gives thanks". Remember that is what happens at the Eucharist. Jesus "gave thanks" over the bread. This time there is seven baskets left over, also a number of fullness, because God created the heaven and the earth in six days and rested on the seventh. We should recall in the number seven how God created the world out of nothing. Therefore God can certainly take the little we have and multiply it for the many hungry. This week we move to chapter sixteen of Matthew and Peter says to Jesus, "You are the Christ the Son of the

living God" (Mt 16:16). Jesus tells Peter, "You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church" (Mt 16:18). He gives Peter the Keys of the kingdom of heaven. It seem clear that Jesus came to establish the church on earth and a key part of this church under Peter's leadership was to bring our gifts to Jesus and let him feed the hungry through our hands. Pope Francis has raised our minds, once again, to this mission of taking care of the vulnerable; just like his namesake Francis of Assisi who dedicated himself to living a life of poverty and serving the needy. Hopefully we too can see this as part of our call and our recent efforts give us a glimpse of what we can do when we bring what we have to Jesus. Fr. Tim
