THOUGHT OF THE WEEK:

20/20 is considered perfect vision. Maybe God is using 2020 for us to see clearly that He's in charge and the only one who can help us!

PASTOR'S NOTES Jesus speaks of his disciples producing fruit that will last in John 15:9-17. The word love is used nine times in this passage and word joy is used twice. In today's parable of the landowner who plants a vineyard and does all that is necessary to make it a fruitful vineyard and then leases it out to servants, Jesus tells of the owner expecting to receive fruit from this vineyard. The ones "The Owner" puts in charge do not give the owner His fruit, rather they treated the ones He sent to get the fruit terribly and even killed His son. They were not fit for the vineyard and they are deprived of that beautiful place. "Therefore, I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit" (Matt 21:43). We have to produce the fruit God wants. I heard recently some people speaking about stewardship. They had built up an amazing business, but they did not see it as their own. They realized that everything had been given to them. Yes they were good stewards of what they received but in the end even their breath of life was a gift. They had committed to using what they had received to produce lasting fruit. It is our responsibility to use well what we have been given and attend to the ones with whom Jesus identifies. We are to produce the "fruit that will last:" love, joy, generosity, peace, patience, kindness, gentleness, goodness, gentleness, love, joy and faithfulness. If we do not produce these fruits we will be thrown out of the vineyard. We will not experience what our hearts long for, nor will we give to the world what God wants. We are to be Christ's Body here on earth that give life to the world and not suck life out of the world through selfishness and paying attention only to our own biological family, but God's whole family. Jesus established a new family on earth that will give life to the whole world. Look at Paul's reading again. "Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving make

your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus" (Phil 4:6-7). Prayer brings the peace that we want and will direct us toward what we need to do so that we can produce fruit that will last!!!
