PASTOR'S NOTES God provides for us, his people, in many ways. Food is essential and when someone "goes all out" to provide a "feast of rich food and choice wines", it is such a gift. In the first reading Isaiah the prophet tells us that the "Lord of hosts" is going to do that on a great mountain. Isaiah says that the God "will destroy death forever.." and "will wipe away the tears from every face " (see Isaiah 26:6-10). That prophecy could only be fulfilled in a transformed world, a world we do not know as of yet. Jesus adds another element to his relationship with his people. He has already gone fully into that new transformed world. Today's gospel talks about a wedding feast that the king gives for us his son. An image of a wedding is a great one for what God has done for us in Christ Jesus. We are connected to Jesus even more intimately than a groom is connected to the bride. God wants an intimate relationship with his people and he wants to celebrate that relationship like a bride and groom want to celebrate their relationship with guests participating. It makes it more special when others join us in this celebration. The Mass (the Eucharist), if seen the way it should be seen, is a joyful opportunity to participate in the life of God and to live forever in that new world where death is conquered and tears are wiped away. Jesus has defeated death and he has given human beings the power of the Spirit to change bread into his glorified body and wine into his blood. He gives us his flesh and blood **now** to give us food for the journey up that glorious mountain that nobody can climb without God's assistance, we often call it heaven. He can transform our families now into a piece of heaven and have relationships of peace, patience, faithfulness and joy in this world, although always tainted by struggles.

This first challenge is to say, "yes" to the invitation and be present at the banquet, but there is also preparation involved. God is giving us the opportunity to put on a wedding garment, baptismal garment, and keep it unstained until everlasting life. We sin, but continually we ask for forgiveness to make it white again. He has even given us the Sacrament of Reconciliation to keep our garment clean and enter into the celebration. Let us say "yes" to God and do our part to wear the wedding garment well or risk being thrown out of the feast, like that man in the gospel (Matt 22:1-14). Fr. Tim
