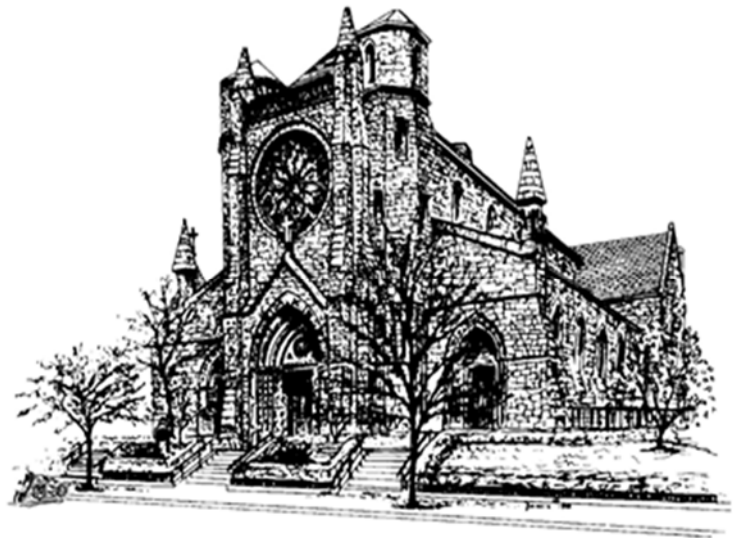
Matrimony
