Coronavirus and Flu Preparedness: Federal and local government officials have asked all people to be health conscious during this time of the spread of the flu virus and the coronavirus (covid 19).

To assist you with this:

- we encourage anyone who is sick or has any symptoms of the flu or coronavirus to stay home and not attend Church services. You are dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday if you are sick
- we encourage you to receive Communion in the hand instead of on the tongue
- we encourage you to offer some form of the Sign of Peace (bow, nod of the head) instead of shaking hands

- we encourage you to wash your hands frequently and use hand sanitizer.
