BULLETIN REFLECTION

At this point in our Lenten journey, it is tempting to grow weary of the spiritual disciplines we have taken on. Today's readings inspire us to remain faithful, in grateful response to a God who loves us so much.



In our first reading, the prophet Ezekiel speaks God's own words to us. "I will put my spirit in you that you may live... I have promised and I will do it, says the Lord." Our God wants to be so closely united to us that we are one with Him. And He has promised He will do it. But only if we make room for Him by making Him THE priority of our lives. Putting God first is a grateful response that is very pleasing to Him.

How can we do this? Our second reading, from Romans, tell us. "Those who are in the flesh cannot please God. But you are not in the flesh... you are in the spirit if only the Spirit of God dwells in you."

The disciplines of Lent and a stewardship way of life are wonderful gifts that free us from too great an attachment to "the flesh." The sacrifices we make as Christian stewards are not meant to restrict our freedom and joy. Quite the contrary. They are tools to help us find the real freedom and joy that only come when we make room in our lives for God.

As we journey closer to the Passion of our Lord, let us intensify our Lenten resolutions and our stewardship way of life, inviting the Holy Spirit to take over more and more of our lives. By Easter, we will be freer to rejoice in Him and truly pleasing to God.

From the Pastor's Desk

Canceled, canceled, canceled! Reviewing this latest Bulletin, I am reminded of how many activities, both Liturgical and otherwise, take place here at American Martyrs. We truly are a life giving and life fulfilling Parish. The Coronavirus has temporarily suspended all of these events and celebrations. It is a trying time for all of us, especially those of us who center our lives around the celebration of the Most Holy Eucharist. Let me reassure you, however, that although the public celebration of the Holy Mass has been suspended for the time being, I am privately celebrating the Mass and honoring all of the intentions which have been presented to us.

It is important for us to remember at times like this, when we are unable to access this great Mystery of our Faith, that the promise of Christ to be with us at all times, while manifest in the Most Blessed Sacrament, is not limited to the physical reception of Communion. Christ is present to us through the power of the Holy Spirit, through the Sacred Scriptures, through the prayers that we utter from the depths of our hearts, and from the community of love that He founded: the Church.

At this time of "social distancing" when we are seemingly deprived of what is essential to our faith, I implore you to practice spiritual communion by uniting yourselves with Christ in the Paschal Mystery (the Mystery of His Life, Death and Resurrection). Pray with the Mass as you watch it on TV. Meditate on the Scripture readings of the day. Offer yourselves to Christ as He offered Himself to us. The day will come when we will once again gather around the Altar of the Lord in thanksgiving and sing His praises.

In the mean time, please take care of yourselves and of one another, because together we are the **BODY OF CHRIST.**
