## Helpful Guidelines for Distribution of the Eucharist

- Please keep your mask on until it is time to receive communion.
- Once you receive communion, please put your mask back on.
- Please keep a prayerful atmosphere after Mass and do not congregate after Mass.
- Congregants will be directed in their cars to exit from the field the opposite from where they entered.
- They will drive around the church on Long Street and enter the parking lot there.
- Cars will be lined up by the Knights of Columbus. They will guide you at every turn.
- Please remain in your cars until instructed to get in line for communion.
- At the Bell Tower, volunteers will create groups of 6 persons (not including small children with parents).
- Communion will be distributed under the portico. Please exit the portico from the same direction you entered.
- Those sitting on the grass in front of the stage, please proceed directly to the sidewalk around the back of the church as di-

rected. You will go behind the sanctuary side of the church directly to the sidewalk (this is opposite from where the cars will be going).

### After Communion

- Please exit where directed.
- You may place your weekly offering in baskets which will be available at communion and as you exit the parking lot.

**If you are not able to receive communion today,**

**the Spiritual Communion Prayer:**

*My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the most Blessed Sacrament. I love You above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there, and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen*
