There has always been a tendency in me to say no to everything; weather I do it or not is a different story. That's why the gospel of today comes to give hopes to me and those who think likewise. Today the liturgy presents to us the Gospel parable of the two sons sent by their father to work in his vineyard. One of them immediately agrees to go but then does not; the other instead refuses but later repents and complies with his father's wishes.

There are moments in our lives that our initial desires is not to say yes to God's will, therefore He has all the rights in the world to despise us and punish us, but he does not. The message of this weekend is full of love and compassion for the sinner. The Lord gives us many chances to change our mind, he is patient and believes that we can change. We are the problem; we are the ones who believe that we will never change, that we cannot stop being the way we are, that we cannot stop that concrete sin that is making me suffer. That's why the key to understand the three readings of today is called humility. Humility is to be able to be at peace with who we are: our sickness, our sins, our character, that we constantly say no to God's will, and at the same time trust that He loves me and is taking care of me.

The opposite of humility is pride, and we see that manifested in our slavery to say yes, knowing that we will not do it. How many times we have said yes to people in order to look good, and in order for people to like us, knowing very well that we won't be able to deliver? This gospel brings out our hypocrisy, that we say and preach many things, but our actions shows otherwise.

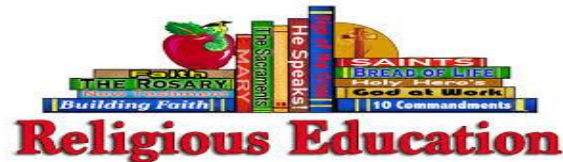

Feast of the Week: St. Therese

Feast Day: Oct 01

Therese Martin was the last of nine children born to Louis and Zelig Martin on January 2, 1873, in Alencon, France. However, only five of these children lived to reach adulthood. Precocious and sensitive, Therese needed much attention. Her mother died when she was 4 years old. As a result, her father and sisters babied young Therese. She had a spirit that wanted everything.

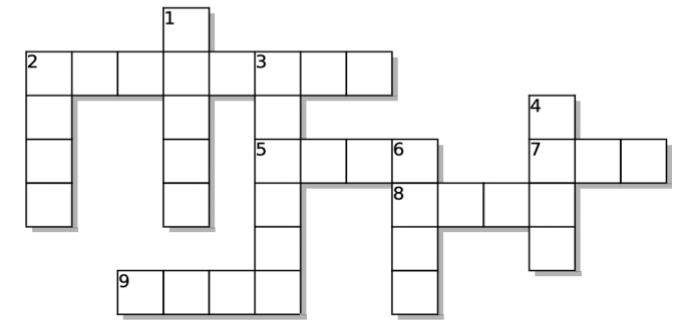
At 15, she entered the Carmelite convent in Lisieux to give her whole life to God. She took the religious name Sister Therese of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face. Living a hidden, simple life of prayer, she was gifted with great intimacy with God. Through sickness and dark nights of doubt and fear, she remained faithful to God, rooted in His merciful love. After a long struggle with tuberculosis, she died on September 30, 1897, at the age of 24. Her last words were the story of her life: "My God, I love You!"

Thérèse said she came to the Carmel convent "to save souls and pray for priests." And shortly before she died, she wrote: "I want to spend my heaven doing good on earth."

It a well-known fact that St Therese had scruples, which are most basically described as a form of religious OCD. Fear that her sins had offended God or that she had committed a mortal sin plagued her at different times in her life.

There is a quote from St Therese that have stuck with me whenever I feel frustrated at my lack of endurance in my faith and it relates to sleep. She said: "I should be distressed that I drop off to sleep during my prayers and during my thanksgiving after Holy Communion. But I don't feel at all distressed. I know that children are just as dear to their parents whether they are sleep or awake and I know that doctors put their patients to sleep before they operate. So I just think that God "knows our frame; he remembers that we are dust."

Hay momentos en nuestras vidas en los que nuestro deseo inicial es decir no a la voluntad de Dios, por lo tanto, Él tiene todos los derechos del mundo para despreciarnos y castigarnos, pero no lo hace. El mensaje de este fin de semana está lleno de amor y compasión para el pecador. El Señor nos da muchas oportunidades para cambiar de opinión, es paciente y cree que podemos cambiar. Nosotros somos el problema; somos los que creemos que nunca cambiaremos, que no podemos dejar de ser como somos, que no podemos detener ese pecado concreto que nos está haciendo sufrir. Por eso la clave para entender las tres lecturas de hoy se llama la / humildad. La humildad es poder estar en paz con quienes somos: nuestra enfermedad, nuestros pecados, nuestro carácter, que constantemente decimos que no a la voluntad de Dios, y al mismo tiempo confiar en que Él me ama y está cuidando de mí.

Lo opuesto a la humildad es el orgullo, y lo vemos manifestado en nuestra esclavitud al decir que sí, sabiendo que no lo haremos. ¿Cuántas veces hemos dicho que sí a la gente para lucir bien y para agradarle a la gente, sabiendo muy bien que no seremos capaces de cumplir? Este evangelio saca a relucir nuestra hipocresía, que decimos y predicamos muchas cosas, pero nuestras acciones muestran lo contrario.

Fiesta de la Semana: Ángeles Custodios

Fiesta: Octubre 02

En la Biblia la palabra Ángel significa "Mensajero", un espíritu purísimo que está cerca de Dios para adorarlo, y cumplir sus órdenes y llevar sus mensajes a los seres humanos.

En el siglo II el gran sabio Orígenes señalaba que "los cristianos creemos que a cada uno nos designa Dios un ángel para que nos guíe y proteja".

En el Nuevo Testamento es tan viva la creencia de que cada uno tiene un ángel custodio, que cuando San Pedro al ser sacado de la cárcel llega a llamar a la puerta de la casa donde están reunidos los discípulos de Jesús, ellos creen al principio, que no es Pedro en persona y exclaman: "Será su ángel" (Hechos 12, 15).

En el año 800 se celebraba en Inglaterra una fiesta a los Ángeles de la Guarda y desde el año 1111 existe una oración muy famosa al Ángel de la Guarda. Dice así: "Ángel del Señor, que por orden de su piadosa providencia eres mi guardián, custódiame en este día (o en esta noche) ilumina mi entendimiento, dirige mis afectos, gobierna mis sentimientos, para que jamás ofenda a Dios Señor. Amen.

Y en el año 1608 el Sumo Pontífice extendió a toda la Iglesia universal la fiesta de los Ángeles Custodios y la colocó el día 2 de octubre.

Mas advertencias sobre el diablo del famoso exorcista Gabriele Amorth

3. "Satanás ataca sobre todo al Papa"

También [en su libro "El último exorcista"](#), el P. Amorth señaló que "Satanás ataca sobre todo al Papa. Su odio por el sucesor de Pedro es feroz. Lo he experimentado en mis exorcismos".

"Después del Papa, Satanás ataca a los cardenales, obispos y a todos los sacerdotes y religiosos. Es normal que sea así. Ninguno se debería escandalizar. Los sacerdotes, religiosos y religiosas, están llamados a una dura lucha espiritual".

4. "Invocar a Juan Pablo II es efectivo contra el diablo"

En mayo de 2011 el P. Amorth [señaló a ACI Prensa](#) que San Juan Pablo II se ha convertido, en los últimos años, "en un poderoso intercesor en la lucha contra el demonio".

"Le he preguntado al demonio más de una vez: '¿Por qué te da tanto miedo Juan Pablo II?' Y he tenido dos respuestas distintas, ambas interesantes. La primera, 'por qué desarmó mis planes'. Y creo que con eso se refiere a la caída del comunismo en Rusia y en Europa del Este. El colapso del comunismo".

"Otra respuesta que el demonio me dio fue 'porque arrebató a muchos jóvenes de mis manos'. Hay muchos jóvenes que, gracias a Juan Pablo II, se convirtieron. Tal vez algunos ya eran cristianos pero no practicantes, y luego con Juan Pablo II volvieron a la práctica", explicó.
