**Father's Column** 

The Month of the Sacred Heart

Each month of the year has ascribed to it a particular devotion. As the feast of the Sacred Heart is usually celebrated in June it thus has become the month of the Sacred Heart.

Devotion to Our Lord's Sacred Heart has a firm foundation in Scripture. The piercing of Jesus's Heart with the soldier's lance on Good Friday corresponded to the rending of the veil in the Temple, signifying access to the divine for all. Secondly, in a deeply intimate moment the Sunday following Easter, we see the healing of St. Thomas's doubt when the Lord bids him to place his hand into His open side, thus touching His pierced and Sacred Heart.

In the providence of history, Our Lord sought to inaugurate explicit devotion to His Sacred Heart by appearing to St. Margaret Mary in France beginning in June of 1675, showing her His open, pierced side saying: "Behold this Heart which has so loved men that it has spared nothing, even to exhausting and consuming itself, in order to testify its love. In return, I receive from the greater part only ingratitude, by their irreverence and sacrileges, and by the coldness and contempt they have for me in this sacrament of love."

The Lord therefore asked St. Margaret Mary to spread devotion to His Sacred Heart while promising: "I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that its all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on nine first Fridays of consecutive months the grace of final repentance; they will not die under my displeasure or without receiving their sacraments, my divine Heart making itself their assured refuge at the last moment."

In addition to this consoling promise, the Lord inspired a feast in honor of His Sacred Heart to be celebrated on the Friday following the week of Corpus Christi—a feast that continued to spread until it was adopted on the universal calendar of the Church.

As Catholics, we do emphasize Christ's relationship with His entire corporate Church. However, such a communal encounter is complemented by individual personal relationships. The feast for the Sacred Heart beautifully captures this aspect of our faith, permitting us to reach out individually, like Thomas amidst the other Apostles, and embrace the Heart that was sacrificed in love for us.

Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us!
