MASS REMINDERS

SEATING will now be on a "FIRST COME, FIRST SEATED" basis. No reservations will be taken; however, you can sign up for next weekend mass on the seating chart in the back of church after mass.

- ✓ **WEAR MASKS**, use hand sanitizer, Maintain a distance of 6 feet from non-family members.
- ✓ Clean your bench before leaving.
- ✓ Sunday mass will continue to be live streamed on our Facebook page.
- ✓ **DISPENSATION** from the Archdiocese for mass is still in effect until further notice.

NOTICE: The new procedures for communion will be:

-Just one line for communion (as we have done previously) BUT, there will be ONE eucharistic minister plus Father Dan distributing communion. They both will be 6 feet apart from each other.

- Use hand sanitizer AND **KEEP** your mask in place while receiving communion.

-We ask that you take **two steps aside before consuming communion.** (take mask off, consume the Body of Christ, and then put mask back on).

-We will still cover the ciboriums (bowls with the Body of Christ) with Corporals.

-**The Extraordinary Eucharistic Minister MUST use a mask** (if someone refuses to use it, we will need to ask a different person to do that service). -The Eucharistic minister won't need to use a Faceshield.

-IF, for some reason someone in the crowd is not wearing a mask they can come and receive communion with me (I will be using my Faceshield).

The upcoming Kansas election matters!

This past Legislative Session, the Kansas Constitutional VALUE THEM BOTH amendment passed the Senate, but came four agonizing votes short in the House.
