- **Answer calls of those in need:** Hearts to Serve helps people who are unable to or cannot go out to get food or who need financial assistance because of the pandemic. The Hearts to Serve Hotline (1.855.423.6780) needs people who are fluent in English and Spanish to serve as Hotline operators for at least one 2-hour shift each week. Please contact the Parish Office at 1.818.341.3680 if you are interested.
- **Become a Vincentian and help others:** Our St. Vincent de Paul Conference helps the poor and homeless in our community. They are in particular need of individuals who are fluent in English and Spanish and individuals who can assist in searching for affordable housing for the poor or homeless Please call the SVDP Conference Help Line at 1.818.341.3513 if you feel called to serve.
- **Sew COVID-19 face coverings:** Wearing face coverings (health masks) is the current "law of the land" to protect your health and that of others. When we are able to gather together for mass or other parish events, parishioners will be required to wear a face covering. We need help to sew about 1,000 face coverings to ensure that everybody will have a face covering if they did not bring their own. - **Staying in touch with shut-ins:** We need help in writing letters and cards for people in the 14 assisted care facilities our parish has served. We want to remind them that they are loved, that we have not forgotten them and that we look forward to seeing them again in the future.
