The toys will be wrapped at St. Martin of Tours on December 18 to be ready for a Christmas party Monday, December 19th that will feature Santa Claus and free pictures of the children with Santa. For many kids, this will be the best present they receive this Christmas.

## KNOW YOUR FAITH

**EDMUND THE MARTYR** was king of East Anglia from about 855 until his death at the hands of Viking invaders. The kingdom of East Anglia was devastated by the Great Heathen Army, a coalition of Norse warriors, who came together under a unified command to invade the four Anglo-Saxon kingdoms that constituted England in AD 865. According to Ælfric of Eynsham in an Old English paraphrase of *Passio Sancti Eadmund*:

*King Edmund, against whom Ivar advanced, stood inside his hall, and mindful of the Saviour, threw out his weapons. He wanted to match the example of Christ, who forbade Peter to win the cruel Jews with weapons. Lo! the impious one then bound Edmund and insulted him ignominiously, and beat him with rods, and afterwards led the devout king to a firm living tree, and tied him there with strong bonds, and beat him with whips. In between the whip lashes, Edmund called out with true belief in the Saviour Christ. Because of his belief, because he called to Christ to aid him, the heathens became furiously angry. They then shot spears at him, as if it was a game, until he was entirely covered with their missiles, like the bristles of a hedgehog (just like St. Sebastian was). When Ivar the impious pirate saw that the noble king would not forsake Christ, but with resolute faith called after Him, he ordered Edmund beheaded, and the heathens did so. While Edmund still called out to Christ, the heathen dragged the holy man to his death, and with one happily to Christ."*



BLESSED MIGUEL PRO was a Mexican Jesuit priest executed without trial on November 23, 1927, on trumped-up charges of bombing and attempted assassination, during what writer Graham Greene called the “fiercest persecution of religion anywhere since the reign of Elizabeth”—Mexico under rule of the fiercely anti-clerical and anti-Catholic President Plutarco Elías Calles. On the day of his death, Fr. Pro blessed the soldiers, knelt and briefly prayed quietly. Declining a blindfold, he faced his executioners with a crucifix in one hand and a rosary in the other and held his arms out in imitation of the crucified



Christ and shouted out, “May God have mercy on you! May God bless you! Lord, Thou knowest that I am innocent! With all my heart I forgive my enemies!” Before the firing squad were ordered to shoot, Pro raised his arms in imitation of Christ and shouted the defiant cry of the Cristeros, “Viva Cristo Rey!”—“Long live Christ the King!”
