KNOW YOUR FAITH

THE ENGLISH MARTYRS

Formerly commemorated by the Church on 25 October [also the feast of Crispin and Crispinian], the Forty Martyrs of England and Wales now join the celebration of all the 284 canonized or beatified martyrs of the English Reformation on 4 May. Because they adhered to the Roman Catholic faith, these men and women—priests, monks, nuns, laymen and laywomen—were executed for treason and related offences in England between 1535 and 1679, many without trial or following show trials. Fifty-four of the martyrs [including Thomas More and Bishop John Fisher] were beatified in 1886 by Pope Leo XIII. The first of these martyrs to be canonized were More and Fisher in 1935. The canonization of the Forty Martyrs followed in 1970. Pope St. John Paul II beatified eighty-five more in 1987. Many other causes for men and women who died in prison on similar charges continue to be examined by the Church.

O Merciful God, who, when thy Church on earth was torn apart by the ravages of sin, didst raise up men and women who witnessed to their faith with courage and constancy: give unto thy Church that peace which is thy will, and grant that those who have been divided on earth may be reconciled in heaven and may be partakers together in the vision of thy glory; through Jesus Christ thy Son our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

PRAYERS FOR THE SICK




