KNOW YOUR FAITH

Mary Magdalene was so called from Magdala near Tiberias, on the west shore of Galilee. In the New Testament, she is mentioned among the women who accompanied Christ and ministered to Him (Luke 8:2-3), where it is also said that seven devils had been cast out of her (Mark 16:9). She is next named as standing at the foot of the cross (Mark 15:40; Matthew 27:56; John 19:25; Luke 23:49). She saw Christ laid in the tomb, and she was the first recorded witness of the Resurrection.

The Greek Fathers, as a whole, distinguish the three persons:

- the "sinner" of Luke 7:36-50, a penitent woman who fell at the feet of Jesus weeping, and anointed his feet with expensive balm and dried them with her hair;
- Mary of Bethany, the sister of Martha and Lazarus, Luke 10:38-42 and John 11; and
- Mary Magdalene, who was exorcised of seven demons and followed the Lord as a disciple.

On the other hand most of the Latins hold that these three were one and the same. Certainly, St. John clearly identifies Mary of Bethany with the woman who anointed Christ's feet (12; cf. Matthew 26 and Mark 14).

The Greek Church maintains that after the Ascension, the saint retired to Ephesus with the Blessed Virgin and there died, that her relics were transferred to Constantinople in 886 and are there preserved. Gregory of Tours supports the statement that she went to Ephesus. However, according to a French tradition, Mary, Lazarus, and some companions came to Marseilles and converted the whole of Provence. Magdalene is said to have retired to a hill, La Sainte-Baume, near by, where she gave herself up to a life of penance for thirty years.



According to tradition, Saint ANNE was born in Bethlehem, and married JOACHIM of Nazareth. In the Protoevangelium of James, Joachim is described as a rich and pious man, who regularly gave to the poor. Tradition has it that the parents of the Blessed Virgin, who, apparently, first lived in Galilee, came later on to settle in Jerusalem.

At the temple, Joachim's sacrifice was rejected, as the couple's childlessness was interpreted as a sign of divine displeasure. Joachim consequently withdrew to the desert, where he fasted and did penance for 40 days. Angels then appeared to both Joachim and Anne to promise them a child.

Joachim later returned to Jerusalem and embraced Anne at the city gate, located in the Walls of Jerusalem. An ancient belief held that a child born of an elderly mother who had given up hope of having offspring was destined for great things. Parallels occur in the Old Testament in the case of Hannah, mother of Samuel.
