SOLEMNITY OF STS. PETER AND PAUL

Tomorrow's solemnity—the Feast of St. Peter and St. Paul—is of ancient Christian origin, the date selected, 29 June, being the anniversary of either their death or the translation of their relics. Established in honour of the martyrdom in Rome of the apostles Saint Peter and Saint Paul, it is celebrated by the entire Church, both in the East and in the West, but is of especial importance to the Roman Catholic tradition. By God's providence these two saints, whose impact was foundational to the entire Church, were led to Rome, and by their proclamation of the Gospel there and by their martyrdom marked Rome as the center of the Christian world. St. Paul and St. Peter are thus patron saints of the Eternal City; on this feast, newly created metropolitan archbishops receive from the pope the primary symbol of their office, the pallium.

This solemnity is a holy day of obligation in the Latin Church, although the US conference of bishops has suppressed the obligation for Catholics in the United States.



As this feast is a memorial of the unity and catholicity of the Church which Christ himself founded upon Peter and which spread throughout the whole world

through the preaching of the Apostle Paul, in commemoration of her apostolic origins and of her unity founded upon the Bishop of Rome, the Church grants a special plenary indulgence on this day.

“A plenary indulgence is granted to the faithful who, on the Solemnity of the Holy Apostles Peter and Paul, make prayerful use of an article of devotion, as

defined by Norm 15, that has been blessed by the Supreme Pontiff or by any bishop, provided the faithful also make a Profession of Faith using any legitimate formula.

“A partial indulgence is granted to the faithful who devoutly use such articles of devotion properly blessed by either a priest or a deacon.” [Manuel of Indulgences, Grant 14]

What counts as a “religious article”?

“The faithful can acquire an indulgence if they use devoutly one of the following properly blessed pious objects, namely: a crucifix or cross, rosary, scapular, or medal.” [Manuel of Indulgences, Norm 15]

To gain the indulgence:

1) While in the state of grace do the following:

a) Pray with a religious article (crucifix/cross, rosary, scapular, or medal) that has been blessed either by the Pope himself or by a bishop.

b) Make a Profession of Faith, for example: The Nicene Creed or the Apostles' Creed.

2) Go to confession within about twenty days before or after, with at least the habitual intention of gaining indulgences.

3) Receive communion within a couple days before or after, with the same intention.

4) Pray for the Holy Father, the Pope (example: Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be)

5) Make an act of the will to detest all sin and to be free from attachment to all sin, even venial sin.

n.b. Only one plenary indulgence can be obtained each day, others will be partial.

Many of us have some of these “objects of devotion” around the house that were blessed by the Pope or by a Bishop, Cardinal etc. So use them tomorrow and get the indulgence for yourself or a soul in Purgatory.
