Capital Improvement Updates from Fr. Nathan Caswell, SJC

With the spring, comes growth, new Catholics, First Communions, Confirmations. God is providing the growth at St. Peter's, drawing many souls to Himself! With the season of growth also comes the season of construction. The church needs to be maintained and beautified because it is the House of God, the place where His Presence abides in the Blessed Sacrament, where Heaven meets earth, and where we go to draw from the Font of Grace.

We are setting out on a project of restoration of St. Peter. There are many projects to do, but we will begin in the next week with the completion of the window frames. The final window to repair is of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The frames on this window have extensively rotted; many pieces could be pulled off by hand. New wooden frames will be made and installed. In May, two other projects are beginning; the installing of new copper flashing around the entire roof that will provide a seal between the roof and the upper parapet walls. The other project will be the tuckpointing of the north façade of the Church. When these projects are complete, the church should be leak free and ready to fix the damaged plaster work.

I will keep you informed as to the progress of the projects and new ones that are upcoming. Some projects will be covered by insurance, some by the funds that many have generously given through the "To Teach Who Christ Is" Campaign and we will begin a new capital campaign to "Restore St. Peter Church". All the donations given to this campaign will go directly to the work of restoring the church. Please use the notation "Restore St. Peter Church" in your donation.

With Gratitude to God and mindful of the protection to the Foster Father of Our Lord, on the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker, I dedicate the work of the restoration of St. Peter Catholic Church to the care of St. Joseph.
