Every Friday evening at 8 pm you can enter Zoom for our meeting.

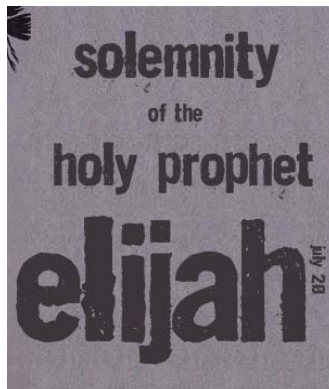
The meeting is from 8 – 9 pm.

HOW TO REPORT ABUSE
